# S-R-O Gotta Go

Beach 120th Street residents unite against threat of homeless housing

Reports of a property owner's designs on turning an abandoned home into a single-room residence on a block that prohibits multi-family dwellings — of 3 or more — has raised the ire of a growing number of Rockaway Park residents.

When Manhattan resident Mimi Fuhrman placed a winning bid of approximately \$550,000 in a public auction to purchase a dilapidated 1-family home at 174 Beach 120th Street back in 2017, local homeowner John Karalis could only guess if the winning bidder would end up making the edifice a permanent residence or turn it into her summer home.

But what he later discovered was equal parts perplexing and disheartening.

"I don't mind renovating it; I don't want it to be a 12-room shelter," said Karalis at The Wave's recent visit to the outside of the 3-story structure in question.

According to applications unearthed by Karalis and Maureen Walsh of Walsh Properties, the current proprietor of the 40' x 100' lot is looking to gain approval from the NYC Department of Housing Preservation and Development (HPD) for a Certificate of No Harassment (CNH).

The document — according to www1.nyc.gov — is what's required by the NYC Department of Buildings before the buyer can attain a permit to alter, demolish or change the shape or layout of single room occupancy (SRO) dwelling.

Two of Fuhrman's attempts to get the necessary approval were denied, with the city's most recent objection occurring on May 15.

While the home was once an SRO, as per Democratic District Leader Lew Simon, it previously served as a summer facility. A year-round site, he states, won't get the city's endorsement.

When contacted by The Wave, Fuhrman — herself a city employee, who works as a senior lease negotiator for the Department of Citywide Administrative Services (DCAS) — insisted that her plans for the abandoned home are still in the preliminary stages. She further related that she has no intentions of doing anything that would compromise the safety of the neighborhood.

She claimed that she originally viewed her purchase as an opportunity to open a beachside bed-and-breakfast getaway given her educational background in hotel and restaurant management.

Those projections, however, were quickly dashed when the longtime real estate continued on page 45

# Debating The Downtown Revitalization

Schools, hospitals, density issues all on the table at update session

A group effort on the part of Councilman Donovan Richards and NYC agency reps to shed light on the progress of \$288 million of investments in Downtown Far Rockaway (DFR) saw residents relate their concerns to the large panel of government officials.

An elaborate PowerPoint presentation narrated by the Economic Development Corporation's Assistant Vice President Erich Bilal at Challenge Preparatory Charter School was followed by questions and comments voiced by skeptical attendees on the topic of affordable hous-

Community Board 14's Dr. Gerald David targeted the increased density (i.e. the influx of new residents entering Rockaway) resulting from the development of residential units particularly in the DFR area.

"The amount of people of moving

into the community, which the city itself said in various meetings is close to 3,000 families and that includes the Mott Avenue rezoning," said David, as he openly wondered if there's enough infrastructure to support new construction.

What we do not want here is what Robert Moses (a former NYC public official known as "The Master Builder") built, which were projects and have a group of people all placed together, which is not a community. It's great to have stores. We want to have a community and not stores

On that note, the CB14 member communicated his dismay with City Council opting to rezone DTR by assigning it an R6 designationused for apartment houses— which reportedly went against the board's wishes of having it remain an R5 area that generally favors one and two-family residences.

Richards didn't share David's views on the ramifications of 600-plus new mixed-income units since 2017, with at least 1,100 more in the pipeline.



# Honoring The **Fallen**


Like many of our neighbors here in Rockaway, The Wave looks forward to the unofficial opening of summer with the arrival of Memorial Day weekend

The beach opening is the first step of the festive holiday weekend that will culminate with barbeques and other celebrations. However, sometimes the excitement of the summer can obscure what Memorial Day really represents.

According to a recent White House study, more than 70 percent of Americans don't know Memorial Day actually means.

As we display our flags and other patriotic decorations in anticipation of the traditional kickoff to summer, perhaps we can take a few moments to comprehend why we are doing so.

The origins of Memorial Day began in 1865, shortly after the end of the Civil War, when a parade of freed slaves and Union soldiers marched through Charleston, S.C.



It wasn't until 1868, when another general, John Logan, the head of the prominent veterans group, the Grand Army of the Republic, issued a proclamation that called for the graves of fallen soldiers to be adorned with flowers. He called it "Decoration Day," and said it should be observed nationwide on May 30 every year.

The date was specifically chosen because it was not on the anniversary of any major battle at that time, and flowers would be readily available. However, because of the Southern origin of the idea, many



communities did not observe 'Decoration Day" due to lingering resentments from the Civil War.

Shortly after the end of World War II, the alternative "Memorial Day," became more commonly used. But it wasn't until 1967 that the day became a federal holiday.

Here endeth the history lesson, but the sentiment should remain.

More than one million American military service members have died in wars that our nation has fought since the first colonial soldiers took up arms in 1775, and we must find even the most simple of ways to honor their sacrifice.

We owe them no less.

# From the lawyer's briefcase

# "Fall from a roof - how much is it worth?"

Labor Law § 240(1) protects construction workers from gravity-related risks such as falling from a height, or being struck by a falling object. Liability under this section is determined by statute. Construction site owners and general contractors can be held strictly liable for violations of this labor law. The plaintiff's fault cannot be considered, which makes

this statute very plaintiff-friendly. However, there are limits to this statute. To sue under Labor Law § 240(1) the injured worker must demonstrate that he/she was engaged in one of the enumerated covered construction activities at the time of the accident

An example of a violation of Labor Law §240 (1) is a case involving a worker that was injured when he fell from a ladder while attempting to remove a large satellite dish. The worker's company had been hired to remove an old satellite dish from the roof of a strip mall. To complete this job, the worker was required to cut the dish into smaller pieces using a jigsaw. To access this location, he had to utilize a ladder. After completing this task, he began to descend on the ladder, when the ladder suddenly shifted, causing the man to fall twenty (20) feet onto the pavement below.

The injured construction worker sued the property owner, the commercial tenant, the tenant's national property management company, the locally retained property management company, and the subcontractor who hired the plaintiff's employer. The defendants named the employer as an additional defendant in a separate legal action. The employer agreed that the injured worker suffered grave injuries and accordingly, the claims against it were not barred by the Workers Compensation Law. In New York, Workers' Compensation Board was established to prevent filing civil lawsuits against the employer. As such no injured party can directly sue the employer. Nevertheless, any named defendant in a construction accident case can bring legal action against the employer of the injured party.

The defendants, in this case, argued that the removal of the satellite dish was not a protected activity under Labor Law § 240(1) and that the actions of the injured worker caused his accident and injuries. The construction worker countered that the demolition and removal of the large dish were required in order to reach portions of the roof that were the subject of very significant repairs and that the work he was doing at the time of the accident was thus a necessary part of the major alteration work. The plaintiff also argued that his fall occurred during the demolition of the satellite dish and that demolition work is specif-

ically mentioned as protected work under Labor Law §

As a result of this accident, the injured man suffered catastrophic injuries, including skull fractures and a traumatic brain injury, resulting in a spastic quadriplegic condition with dysphagia, contractures, incontinence, and loss of verbal interaction. Because of the

severity of the man's injury, it was initially feared that he would remain in a permanent vegetative state.

The plaintiff eventually regained consciousness. His doctors stated that despite the devastating nature of his brain injuries and his inability to talk, he nonetheless displayed sufficient ability to be aware of the nature of his unfortunate situation. The plaintiff provided the defendants with a video depicting the plaintiffs mother sitting next to his hospital bed telling him a story. He smiled at the end of the story. Plaintiff argued that this evidence demonstrated that he was able to understand the story, even though he was not able to communicate verbally. The defendants disagreed with the plaintiff and argued that he was not aware of his surroundings after the fall.

The plaintiff also submitted an economic expert who argued that the cost of his lifetime care ranged \$5,000,000 - \$12,000,000, depending upon the level of care and whether plaintiff remained as an in-patient at a rehabilitation facility or was transitioned to his home.

The plaintiff moved for summary judgment and all of the defendants moved to dismiss the plaintiff's case. While the motions were pending before the court case settled for \$6,800,000. The employer insurance carrier paid \$5,750,000. The plaintiff also received \$50,000 from the national property manager, \$350,000 from the commercial tenant, \$150,000 from the landowner, and \$500,000.00 from the local property management company. The subcontractor had not responded to this legal action. In addition, the employer/compensation carrier agreed to waive their workers' compensation lien in this case of approximately \$1,000,000 and agreed to cover the plaintiff's medical and related expenses for his lifetime.

Before heading back to the beach, take some time to work off that de-





# Better Safe Than Sorry



To prepare for hurricane season, PSEG Long Island conducted its annual emergency preparedness drill on May 21.

PSEG Long Island assembled key personnel and representatives from other emergency response organizations yesterday to conduct its annual emergency preparedness drill. This drill is in preparation for emergency response and restoration in the event a severe storm affects Long Island and the Rockaways.

"At PSEG Long Island, safety and efficient storm response is of utmost importance," said John O'Connell, vice president of transmission and distribution for PSEG Long Island. "We have learned during prior catastrophic events that coordinating our services with other first responders and local agencies is essential when executing on our plan to restore the system. The drill allows us the opportunity to test our current strategies and ensure we are prepared to communicate with our customers."

The drill is an interactive exercise for PSEG Long Island to test its major storm preparedness and procedures implemented as a result of lessons learned from previous storms. Participants are provided a scenario in which they engage with other emergency personnel to simulate and test processes.

Operational processes tested include:

- Enacting the flood restoration protocol which includes procedures and coordination with towns and villages for customers impacted by flooding.
- Prioritizing the clearing of critical roadways by working with towns, villages and the respective county Emergency Operation Centers (EOCs).

 Logistics processes that improve efficiency of external restoration resources.

Communication processes tested include:

- The use of press releases, emails and social media to convey pertinent information to customers and other key stakeholder groups.
- Regionalizing the Municipal Storm Calls to enable the dissemination of more localized and geographic specific information to elected officials and municipal leaders.
- Provide information to Life Support Customers for them to make an educated emergency plan.
- Activating the Mobile Command Unit and Roving Liaisons to hardest hit areas to provide outage and restoration information to customers.
- Utilizing previously captured customer e-mail addresses for direct communication with all customers during storm events.

The Long Island Power Authority and the New York State Department of Public Service; various emergency response organizations including New York State Office of Emergency Management; utility companies, including National Grid, Cablevision and Verizon; various local, county and state emergency response entities; and the National Weather Service attended, participated and observed the drill.

# \$101 billion and our future on the line



Coastal resiliency isn't a new issue for NYC Comptroller Scott Stringer, seen here in Rockaway in 2017, giving a rousing speech in which he shared his impatience with the government's lack of action in restoring Rockaway.

With over 520 miles of coastline, New York City sits on the frontlines of climate change. And over six years ago, our shores were slammed by Superstorm Sandy causing 17 percent of our city to be flooded costing an estimated \$14 billion in damages. Homes were destroyed, businesses were washed away, futures were upended, and 54 New Yorkers lost their lives as a result of the unprecedented devastation the storm caused across all five boroughs.

Sandy was a 1-in-260 year storm. But as sea levels rise and climate change accelerates, our city could see more ferocious storms as often as every five years. It's happening all across the country including in Houston, Texas, which just experienced three 500-year floods within a threeyear stretch. Considering the latest climatic trends, scientists now estimate that Sandy-like flooding could be a one in a five-year event by mid-century in our city. Climate change is an emergency – and time is running out.

The bottom line is that we need to act faster because make no mistake that taking action is both a moral obligation and a financial imperative to get ahead of tomorrow's storms. Any politician who talks about twenty, thirty, or fifty year plans to tackle this crisis isn't matching the urgency of the moment.

That's why my office sounded the alarm with a new report revealing that our communities are still dangerously exposed to future storms. We found that of the \$14.7 billion New York City received in federal funds to help Sandy survivors rebuild and to invest in resiliency - the City had spent just 54 percent as of March 2019. Špecifically, we have managed to spend only 20 percent of the FEMA dollars earmarked for City hospitals, just 41 percent of the money to protect NYCHA and a meager 14 percent of the \$470 million intended for coastal resiliency projects.

It's understandable that city projects take time and federal red tape only makes it more difficult to navigate the myriad layers of bureaucracy, but too much is at stake to continue with our current approach. We cannot afford to kick this can down the road, and we certainly can't leave this to another generation to solve. The time for action is now because our shorefront communities are a crit-

ical piece of our overall economy.

My office ran the numbers and found that a staggering \$101.5 billion in property value is located in the most flood-vulnerable areas of our city. That figure represents growth of more than 73 percent since 2010. And it's New Yorkers' homes, businesses, and entire life savings that are on the line.

The Queens waterfront, which was particularly hit hard by Sandy, has experienced a staggering increase in property value within the floodplain in the past decade — now valued at \$35.5 billion up from \$15.6 billion in 2010, a 127.7 percent increase. Significant portions of the borough's coastline already face regular flooding from high tide, let alone the risk of a major weather event with communities such as Howard Beach and the Rockaway Peninsula expected to face monthly tidal flooding by 2050.

If we don't move fast to protect our coast - and that means all 520 miles of our coast - then New Yorkers will be at the mercy of the next wave of disasters. Because there's no question that another Sandy will come - and we can't be putting shovels in the ground as the next storm barrels toward us.

That's why we need the City to expedite resiliency projects and create a comprehensive citywide coastal resiliency plan that doesn't just plan for 2050 or 2030, but right now. There should be resiliency retrofit loans made available for coastal communities and opportunities for residents to relocate. Substantive resources and energy should be devoted to optional neighborhood-based buyout programs for areas of our city that aren't just vulnerable to superstorms but are getting hit by flooding events on a monthly basis. And we should strengthen the Build It Back framework so that we have recovery programs that are well prepared for the next superstorm.

Every day I feel the urgency of this battle when I look at my two little boys, Max and Miles, and think about what kind of world they will grow up in. They deserve a habitable planet and an all-hands-on-deck approach. Every child does, and so does every senior who built up our city and saw their life's work washed away.

We need to create a more resilient New York for generations to come. Let's take on this crisis for them and for our future with all of our might.

# Locals Get CCNYC Neighborhood Grants

The Citizens Committee for New York City (CCNYC) has a mission: to help New Yorkers - especially those in low-income areas – come together and improve the quality of life in their neighborhoods.

In 2019 alone, CCNYC has awarded \$665,217 grants to 298 resident-led groups to carry out a range of community improvement projects in nearly 150 different neighborhoods under its Neighborhood Grants program.

Each organization is receiving grants of up to \$3,000 and access to project planning assistance from Citizens Committee staff, free skills-building workshops, and an equipment loan library to help support their projects.

The 2019 Neighborhood Grants were officially presented to volungroups at Citizens Committee's annual Grantee Mixer on May 14, which brought together neighborhood leaders from each organization. The mixer, held at St. Ignatius Church on the Upper East Side, included a grant orientation session and an opportunity for residents to network and share advice and best practices with each other. The groups will continue to work closely with CCNYC staff as the projects are carried out in the coming months.



Rockaway was awarded a generous share of these grants:

Journey Through Seth's Eyes (\$1,790; Far Rockaway)

Journey Through Seth's Eyes is facilitating workshops with parents of children with disabilities. Workshops topics include legal rights, health care opportunities, and other services available to parents, as well as job readiness workshops specifically for teenagers with mental disabilities. The group is broadcasting the workshops and

training sessions through its podcast network as a way to increase accessibility to the workshops.

#### Friends of Seaside Playground (\$1,750; Rockaway Park)

Friends of Seaside Playground is partnering with local artists, residents, and a school to create a community mural in a neglected area of the playground. The group is engaging residents in the renewal process of the space through painting days of a design voted on by the community. By engaging community stakeholders, the group is fostering a sense of ownership and pride in the space and planting the seeds of stewardship in all involved in the process.

#### **Wink Beauty Parlour** (\$2,830; Far Rockaway)

Wink Beauty Parlor is fostering a greater sense of self-confidence within young women in the community. By incorporating workshops about haircare and makeup application with motivational and self-reflection sessions led by local speakers, the group is providing participants with the tools to build up their self-esteem.



# Downtown, Everything's Waiting For You



On July 1, 2016, for the first time since Superstorm Sandy, our boardwalk was made whole, connecting the peninsula from east to west.

On July 1, 2016, the Rockaway Boardwalk re-connected the peninsula for the first time since the destruction of Superstorm Sandy.

"The reopening of the entire Rockaway Boardwalk is a major milestone for the Rockaway community," said NYC Parks Commissioner Mitchell J. Silver.

Like any major project, the rebuilding of the boardwalk had its problems, several of them major, but its return has made the resurgence of Rockaway an incredibly powerful thing. Millions of visitors have made and will make their way here – again -- to the boardwalk to take a walk, ride a bike, snap a few photos of the sunrise or simply feel the warm ocean breeze.

Perhaps most importantly, the boardwalk creates the opportunity for visitors and locals to travel to each end of Rockaway, and along the way, the opportunity to explore the vibrant communities that make up our "One Rockaway."

You can ride a bike from Belle Harbor to Beach 9th Street, and a quick 10-minute bike ride can get you to the warm, inviting Mama's Cooking. Marlene Josephs runs Mama's, a superb West Indian and American restaurant on Beach 21st Street.

If you like an old school diner with quick and courteous service, there's Ralph's Diner (or Ralph's Coffee Shop, depending on who you ask) on Mott Avenue, which is characterized as a Spanish-American Resturant, but serves a great breakfast menu all day.

When we asked Councilman Dono-


van Richards where he liked to eat when he was in the neighborhood, Ralph's was one of his choices.

He also listed Gino's (10-38 Beach 20th Street), the Corner Coffee Shop (10-61 Beach 20th Street) and Taco Y Mas (1831 Mott Ave) as among his go-to spots.

Community Board 14's District Manager Jon Gaska also listed the Corner Coffee Shop as a favorite, but gushed about Tio Pollo (1921 Mott Ave)

"That place is great," sighed Gaska, Clearly, he's a fan.

When you head back to the boardwalk, you can chillax at Dred Surfer Bar & Grill. Owned by Charles




Owner and chef at Dred Surfer Grill, Charles Jacobs (right) says he sees his establishment as "an ambassador to showcase the beauty of Far Rockaway and its people." Jacobs and his wife Mercedes, the place serves what Charles describes as "Caribbean American specialties." Jerk chicken dinners, jerk chicken and veggie wraps, oxtail dinners, curried chicken, fish nachos, fish and chips, grilled salmon, salmon burger, sorrel, ginger beer, beer, wine and more.

It's one of the more popular places in Far Rockaway, a testament to hard work and a brighter vision for his community.

"[Many] years ago, my neighbor and I would ride the train to work to Manhattan and we would talk about things that would help make the Rockaways a vibrant community," recalled Jacobs. "Today, Dred Surfer is just one of many new small businesses popping up on the peninsula that is beginning to showcase the uniqueness of the Rockaways. I see [my place] as an ambassador to showcase the beauty of Far Rockaway and its people. We are trying to change the perception that any place else is better to have good food and good entertainment other than the Rockaways.

Moving further down to Arverne, which is becoming one of the hottest destinations on the peninsula, you can start at Goody's. Located at 7018 Amstel Blvd in Arverne, Gary and Josephine "Joan" Robinson came




The Wave kicked off the #PhotoFriday challenge back in December 2018 to showcase our beautiful beach community and promote talented Rockaway-based photographers.



# NYPD Lew District leader nominated for 100th Pct CC president at public meeting president at public meeting

Democratic District Leader Lew Simon is one step away from taking over the reins of the 100th Precinct Community Council, with official elections slated for the group's June meeting.

The Rockaway Park-based activist would take over for the Community Council's former leader Joe Young, who recently announced his retirement from the post.

Longtime Community Council Vice President Kathy Heavey publicly addressed the shakeup at the May 22 session held at the 100th Precinct's Rockaway Beach Boulevard station house by lauding the outgoing president, who wasn't in attendance.

"I just want to say thank you to Joe Young. He served the community well for many years. He did an 18-year stint in many positions of the Community Council, which is no small job. So, good luck to him and thank you for his service."

The other vacated position was corresponding secretary, as eligible voters agreed to declare Jean Daouphars as the sole nominee for the role.

The mission of the Community Council, as detailed by NYPD guidelines, includes establishing and maintaining working partnerships between the police and community members, along with contributing in the efforts of improving public safety and quality of life.

Wednesday night's affair also featured Deputy Inspector Louron Hall, the commanding officer of the 100th Precinct, alert civilians of a growing pattern of domestic violence incidents in his com-

When rattling off the latest crime stats, Hall acknowledged a 75-percent in spike in overall

criminal activity that was driven by felony assaults and grand larcenies. Many of the felony assaults — 11 of 13 to be exact — involved domes-

"We see troubling issues, concerns that we're going to be doing an aggressive push on as far as domestic violence. What's also troubling is all the domestic violence we've taken in the 28-day period, not all, but a large percentage — 9 of 11 — occured in Sector Adam, which is the furthest eastern portion of the precinct," stated Hall.

Attendees were informed of a concerted undertaking on the part of local officers to educate residents about domestic violence in hopes of reducing the rates of violent acts in that category. Year-todate numbers indicate a 50-percent spike in domestic violence on a local level encompassing the areas from Breezy Point to Arverne.

One of the precinct's current outreach initiatives involves table-top set ups along portions of Rockaway Beach Boulevard, where brochures and additional resources are being made available.

Social media, added Hall, is another tool that his command is utilizing to spread the word against domestic violence. The 100th Precinct's Twitter account currently boasts over 8,500 followers.

As for grand larcenies, the commanding officer explained how an overwhelming amount of those offenses are the result of unattended property, as perpetrators are getting their hands on several wallets and handbags.

He also noted the rampant practice of handle surfing throughout the peninsula, with individuals checking for unlocked car doors.

Among the other speakers on hand was Queens Family Court Deputy Borough Chief Richard A. Fasano, who touched on his divison's commitment to keep youth off the path of the criminal justice

When detailing a few of the crimes youngsters are partaking in, the former Bronx ADA mentioned an increase of incidents in which victims are lured to various locations via Snapchat or Instagram.

During the closing portions of the meeting, P.O. Jonathan Mercado, a Sector A NCO, referenced active beach patrols in Belle Harbor and Riis Park in response to underage drinking.

"I'm there every Friday and Saturday night," he promised.


# O-O-Oklahoma and Doubt

My wife called me early Wednesday morning with news that she had just won the lottery but dreams of great wealth quickly disappeared when she made it clear it was for that day's matinee performance of Oklahoma. It turned out to be one of the best and most exciting theater experiences we've had.

A decade ago, the Rockaway Theatre Company did a memorable production of the 1943 ground-breaking Oklahoma which changed Broadway musicals forever. I loved the RTC production which was loaded with some of the most talented performers and the most elaborate sets in the history of the RTC. I wasn't yet involved with Tony Homsey's construction crew, but Tony informs me it was one of the most involved sets to construct --- especially that surrey with the fringe on top. I taped the show three or four times and couldn't get

The buzz on the current revival on Broadway is that it is a totally reimagining of the show with a lot of the wholesomeness replaced with darker and edgier themes. But the play went even beyond that – the staging at the smallish Circle in the Square theater with seating on three sides and not a bad seat in the house – added to the experience. Garlic is everything

Garlic has been a part of my life since I can recall smelling. It was "the aroma of the home". When I was about 10 years old, my mother showed me how to chop and slice it THIN. I take garlic for granted I

suppose. It's like water, a necessity to life! Maybe that's why I've never thought to write about this precious culinary ingredient, until now.

The thought came about when I heard that my friend Diane Cardwell, also a member of the Beach 91st Street Community Garden, planted garlic over winter and had a successful harvest this month! It's easy to grow in our zone 7. You plant the cloves flat side down in autumn, a month before the frost. It's harvested in late spring. Just take care to plant it deeply - 6-8 inches. This is to prevent the cloves from freezing. When they thaw, it can cause mold or rot. I have to plant garlic this autumn - #gardengoals.

Garlic is the cousin to the onion, shallot, leek, and chive. There are over 120 cultivars. Its origins are not from the Garlic is everything.

Besides the obvious culinary applications, there are many alternative uses for garlic. My friend Melissa Draugsvold swears by "garlic shots" when she gets sick. Mix shaved garlic with apple cider vinegar and a dash of cayenne pepper and honey. The shot will clear your congestion instantly! There is historical merit to her tincture.

Ancient Egypt, Greece, Rome, China, and India each have recorded medicinal garlic remedies. It seemed to treat just about any ailment - bladder infections, leprosy, asthma, pneumonia, and even animal



bites. It was and still is considered to "stimulate the senses" which is why monks refrain. Garlic was used as a performance-enhancing supplement in the classical Greek Olympics! What's remarkable is that each of these distant

cultures discovered the valuable properties of garlic independent of each other.

Then there's garlic and voodoo. My great grandmother, Anna Sanfilippo who we called "little grandma" because she didn't have legs (diabetes), gave my grandmother (her daughter-inlaw) the evil eye when she moved right next door to the newlyweds. My grandmother swore the curse changed the dynamic of her marriage for the worse. Before the spell, it was all romantic bliss. My mom told me after little grandma died, they found a feather and garlic under her bed. What does it mean????

The concept of witchery followed my ancestors from Sicily to New York. Stregheria is what American Italians call it. Witchcraft that is Catholic-based folklore with little connection to authentic Sicilian spell-casting. I see the connection even in myself today, obsessing over "the bad things that could happen". The Holy Water my mother blessed the house with when we bought it, to cleans the home of evil; the appearance of the soccer ball (that's another column); the must-have Blessed Mother in the garden, spreading her light over the flowers; and the rosary beads that NEED to hang over the mirror in the car so I don't get in an accident, (Incidentally, I've never gotten in a car accident).

Now that I'm thinking of it, I should hang some garlic above the doorway.



This week, The Wave visited with the Amato brothers, Frank and Tony, who run Elegante Pizzeria on Rockaway Beach Boulevard, a community staple that is so much more than a pizza joint after 30 years+ working on the peninsula.

Chatting over the counter, Frank explained that people who have left Rockaway always come back to visit Elegante, including former employees: "the first thing they do coming over the bridge, they gotta' stop off for pizza or a chicken roll," he said with a smile. For the Amato brothers, people coming back just to get a taste of their pizza is always great Monday Motivation and a regular occurrence. But Frank said they never run out of steam despite working 14-16 hour days due to a love of the job and their customers.

Every Monday morning, the two brothers meet before opening to review the past weeks business, but

"almost every week it turns into us reflecting on all the wonderful encounters we had with our customers in the past week."

"We find that relaying the stories about our wonderful customers and community helps us to remember and focus on how fortunate we are," Frank added. "We get to serve pizza and authentic Italian food to so many wonderful people. We love putting a smile on all our customers faces."

Fortunately, Elegante always does well throughout the quieter winter months having been a part of locals' lives for the past 37 years and counting. Despite their success, Frank acknowledged that their are always continued on page 43

# Beam Crashes Down In Belle Harbor Details issued at BHPOA meeting

A recent incident that saw a steel beam fall from the top of a school building currently under construction was among the key topics discussed at the May 21 Belle Harbor Property Owners Association (BHPOA) meet-

BHPOA 1st Vice President John Signorelli referenced the Apr. 4 occurence in which the 20-foot vertical fixture "fell over" from the new PS 256 edifice— located at 445 Beach 135th St.— which made contact with nearby power lines.

The 60-foot tumble, according to Signorelli, caused an electrical outage inside PS 114 and PS 256, located across the street from the site. Students from the neighboring school subsequently evacuated the facility, where no injuries were reported.

"There was no construction for 3-4 weeks. I'm sure the agency (NYC School Construction Authority) got involved," said the civic executive

member and retired architect.

A new partitioned walkway was created for local students going to and from school in the event that "anything comes falling off again," added Signorelli.

The company entrusted with the development of the special-needs establishment is T. Moriarty & Son. The Wave made a request for an incident report from the SCA and was later contacted by one of their reps, Kevin Ortiz.

The SCA spokesperson recounted how the bolts from the steel column failed to hold the beam at approximately 12 noon. Members of the NYPD, FDNY and PSEG responded to the potentially disastrous blunder with the power company deciding to cut off electricity to the surrounding buildings for 2 hours while the supporting structure was removed.

Belle Harbor locals also learned of efforts on the part of the civic group to continued on page 34



The Rockaway Development and Revitalization Corporation (RDRC) held its 33rd Annual Tribute and Gala Dinner on May 15, acknowledging those who have made a difference in the community.

Kevin Alexander, RDRC's President and CEO, congratulated the honorees for their work in the community.

"It's been my pleasure for the last 13 years to stand here before you and tell you all the good things and challenges that we face, not just as RDRC but members of a broader community in Rockaway and Broad Channel," said Alexander. "The biggest thing you need to know is that while revitalization is happening, new buildings, new streets, new businesses [are being built], the most important thing one can do is build the people."

Recipients of the Community Builders Award were Mrs. Dolores M. Hofman, Shanel Thomas-Henry, Pastor David Cockfield, and Curtis Archer. Recipients of the RDRC Chairwoman's Award were Enid Glabman, Hilda Gross, and Queen Makkeda.

Hofman has worked in the aviation

industry for 53 years and is currently the Program Manager of the Queens Air Service Development Office (ASDO). During her time there, the program has facilitated 9,500 contracts valued at over \$1.5 billion. She was inducted as being the first woman to drive a forklift and unload trucks at JFK by the Pan Am Museum Foundation.

"I'm really proud of that, I wouldn't trade one day of it for anything else," said Hofman. "The (ASDO) through funding by the Port Authority Administration has enabled me to help the community. 




Pico RBNY is known for being a cool, contemporary Mexican kitchen offering classic street food, but it has a killer brunch too.



# 10 Years Ago...

After being away from Rockaway since her running well behind both winner Eric Ulrich and fellow Democratic District Leader Lew Simon in the recent race for the City Council seat vacated by Joseph P. Addabbo Jr., Geraldine Chapey is back in town. People tell us that she and her mother showed up for some affairs at Russo's on the Bay, and at a Queens Democratic Party dinner recently, but that she has been keeping a low profile on the peninsula.

The storefront office that houses Chapey Trinity Services has been closed on most days, but has been open during evening hours on occasion. There is no word from the Chapey camp on whether or not she will run again for the Council seat in November.

A number of Broad Channel residents, who still use bottled gas for cooking and heating, have received bills from StarLite, the Bay Shore (Long Island) company that furnishes the gas. Some of them no longer use the company, while others are still active customers.

In any case, the bills ask for hundreds of dollars in "Tank Rental" fees. When one woman called and told them to come and pick up the tanks, because she no longer uses them, she was told that she would have to pay the fee anyway. Several locals have told The Wave that they have been told by their legal advisors that they do not have to pay the fee, and they will not. This is just another scam," said one man who still uses the service. I have two tanks filled with gas that I purchased from them and haven't used. Now, they want me to pay \$260 extra because I have the tanks.'

A Brooklyn federal judge is weighing arguments that would allow thousands of mentally disabled residents to move out of adult homes, such as the Surfside Manor and the Park Inn Hotel, to state-supported apartments spread throughout the community. The argument is that moving from the homes to apartments would allow the mentally ill patients to live more independently and enjoy a better quality of

Proponents for the mentally ill say that the adult homes are essentially functioning as satellite mental institutions where residents are left to languish." That may be true, but do you want them living next door or upstairs?

# 20 years ago...

Now that the City Council has put an end to bullying in schools and is working on a new bill to end daytime, Congressman Anthony Weiner has chimed in with a bill that would stop sexual harassment on college campuses. The bill would require all colleges and universities to identify acts that constitute sexual harassment and to notify students that sexual harassment is against the law (as if they didn't already know that) and would mandate that the schools "describe procedures to be followed to file sexual harassment grievances and obtain victim assistance.'

Someday, our legislators are going to wake up and realize that you really can't legislate human behavior unless you are willing to put people in jail for criminality. Making a pass at a member of the opposite sex or telling him or her that they look good that day is not criminality, and cannot be done away with by signing a bill any more than a law can do away with bullying.

We have heard that many more lifeguards will be available for Rockaway's beaches this year than in previous years. That is good news for locals because it may mean that the majority of the local beaches will remain open this season. Of course, we still have to deal with eroded beaches and Piping Plovers, but that has become a yearly burden for Rockaway.

We can only hope that the increase in lifeguards will be coupled with a realistic enforcement of beach and boardwalk rules as well as a relaxing of the asinine curfew that Commissioner Benepe and his minions have put on our beautiful beach. City Councilman Joe Addabbo has told us that the first time a local resident gets a ticket for walking on the beach or the boardwalk after the imposed curfew, he will act to get the curfew extended.







# Portrait Of An Artist: Carolin Wood

Given the vibrancy of Rockaway's artistic community, we figured that the cover of The Rockaway Summer Guide should feature the work of a local artist. To find the right piece, we asked several of our friends to help

Thanks to Paula DiGioia, one of the Wave's graphic design-

ers -- and author of "The Glorified Tomato" column -- James Dalid of the Rockaway Artists Alliance and our cartoonist Tom Kerr, we got a lot of entries.

Finally, we selected "Monument for Fish" by Carolin Wood. She was so excited to be chosen, we decided we wanted to learn more about her and her work.

Wave: How The

would you describe your art?

Carolin Wood: My art is about stories and the treasures that I collect living in Rockaway, working as a gardener for NYC Parks, and playing and collaborating with my two children and their friends. Lately, I have been collaging and painting.

**The Wave:** What is it about Rockaway that makes it such an attraction for the artistic community?

Carolin Wood: On a practical level. Rockaway offers affordable living spaces with room for art. The physical landscape of urban meets ocean is wild. And wild spaces attract artistic people. It's a naturally inspiring environment. The pace is slower and I don't get so wrapped up in the city hustle. Places like Jamaica Bay Wildlife Refuge are such a gem; I can get lost there for hours.

The Wave: How / when did you discover Rockaway?

Carolin Wood: The first time I was in Rockaway was actually a month before Sandy. I fell in love with this place and knew the next time I moved it would be out here.

The Wave: Let's talk about the cover art, what does "Monument for Fish" mean for you?

Carolin Wood: When I moved out here in 2015 I was starting a new life. I was scared, excited, and with so much to learn. I was finding my way, and in a sense, learning to fish (not literally!), taking care of my family on my own. In this community, I see families with traditions so connected to the water. Swimming, surfing, boating and — fishing! It's in the community's blood and is priceless. This connection to the environment can't be valued in a market sense or captured fully in a monument. This piece speaks to the delicate and dynamic relationship. A project like the Williams Pipeline


opens up a deep fear that we will lose this relationship to place and this community and would have instead of something as absurd as a monument to fish.

**The Wave:** What are some of your favorite things about summer in Rockaway?

Carolin Wood: After a day working in the parks, being able to jump into the ocean before the beach gets packed. Finding treasures on the beach and the bay. Hanging out with the fishermen and listening to their endless stories. Sailing the bay at sunset.

**The Wave:** What's next for you projectwise? Where can people find your work?

Carolin Wood: I have some projects in the works but, I don't want to jinx it (fingers crossed). Im always up for a frosty on the boardwalk and I welcome any love on my IG @carolin\_wood. When my next project is finalized, I will post details




Birth of Redheads, Drawing, by Carolin Wood

Chances are the person who coined the phrase "the best things in life are free,"may have just finished taking in the sounds and pageantry of Rockstock and Barrels.

This year's surf/skate/music festival spectacular—the 13th in its history— promises to feature an intriguing collection of artists as part of a day-long boardwalk celebration on June 15.

"We provide an opportunity for original bands to perform original music. We are open to all genres and the only prerequisite is that the band performs its own material," explained Walker Hornung, one of the founding fathers of the yearly

In 2003, Walker, Jimmy Dowd of St James Clothing, and Steve Stathis of Boarders Surf Shop lobbied the NYC Parks Department for a local skate park, and a designated surf beach in 2003, so the only thing left to do was bring the music and the people down to Rockaway Beach to celebrate.

So, in 2006 the first Rockstock was created.

"The [Rockstock and Barrels] baby has grown into a teenager," laughed Dowd. "That's what someone said to me recently, and I thought about and yeah, that's kind of rad."

Dowd, Stathis, and Hornung have

always made sure the event as free for everyone, no matter how much it has grown over the years.

We believe people should come out to support Rockstock 13 for all the reasons of the prior years: great music, the surf competition and it's free. Free is rare. In order for those involved to continue presenting the neighborhood with free music, we need the support of vendors and locals by attending.'

The 2019 edition includes a number of familiar faces, such as Rattrap Bumpkin, Indaculture and the Ecstatic Madmen, as well as a trio of newcomers led by jazz songstress Sasha Dobson, violinist Morgan Weidinger and French pop-rock/folkrock sensation LiLi Roquelin.

During a recent interview with The Wave, Hornung couldn't contain his enthusiasm when speaking about Weidinger, assuring that the young St. Louis native is "the best thing I've seen in two or three years," and predicted that she'll someday be a household name.

The long-time rocker-producer also singled out The Skells, when referencing some of the local acts on the bill by calling the surf-punk combo 'an uncompromising original band that likes to push the boundaries."

Horning himself will also be performing with Brotherhood of the

"I'm working with somebody else who's going to help me with the project. They're going to own more of it

who's going to help me with the project. They're going to own more of it than me of course. But I'm not relinquishing any say. I'm going to make sure things are nice," said Fuhrman when asked about her partnership with Steven Kates, a noted landlord and real estate investor.

While Fuhrman wouldn't disclose how much of a stake her associate owns in the house or how they split their expenses, she did come clean on her objective to help out some of her down-on their-luck friends by offering them rooms at the 174 Beach 120th Street location.

She spoke to The Wave about a former colleague with a "really good position," who recently lost her job and was forced to sleep on Fuhrman's couch as an example of the type of individuals she would welcome into her house once it's renovated.

Another person she would be looking to move in is a homeless veteran who reportedly wasn't allowed to sleep in a city shelter because of the man's refusal to part ways with his dog.

"So, I kind of said to myself that it would be nice to help people who are working and who need a place," added Fuhrman, who promised that the homeless vet she encountered would be exception and not the rule when selecting the occupants of her SRO setup.

"How it turned into every single person being a vet and taking every homeless person off the street is beyond me. I want to keep one [room] for myself, so I wasn't going to have anyone living there who wasn't right."

Neighboring homeowners weren't buying the Manhattanite's benevolence, including Rockaway Civic Association Vice President Bobby Zimmer, who believes Fuhrman made

a "backdoor deal" with the city's "higher-ups" in targeting the property as a cash cow before it became available.

Karalis shared some of the same misgivings by calling the integrity of her partner (Kates) into question. The 9th-year Beach 121st Street resident recognized the co-investor as a "slumlord," and pointed to online reports that identify the man as a "scam artist." Attempts by The Wave to contact Kates were unsuccessful due to his listed phone number not accepting messages.

Karalis, Walsh and others on the block are left wondering why the New Jersey native couldn't simply repair the home and rent it to reputable working tenants.

It was noted that she may be losing out on an exorbitant amount of additional income if she opted to go the traditional route. Under the SRO model, the city could reportedly furinish each SRO occupant with upwards of \$3,200 that would logically end up straight in the pockets of the ownership team.

Moreover, Karalis believes that Fuhrman isn't only motivated by greed, but also by fear due to financial hardship, as he revealed that she approached him in 2018 to gauge his

interest in buying the property from her.

"She said, 'I'm looking to make 100 grand more than what I paid.' I said that I would look into it for her and maybe find someone who could buy it. I actually texted her as early as last month with someone interested in buying it and she told me that it's in contract," he explained.

Meanwhile Michelle Luhrs and Stephanie Perez shared their unease with the types of individuals who could be making their way into Rockaway Park if Fuhrman gets the city to sign off on her next CNH application.

"My concern is a lot of those people that are homeless, they have mental

issues. If you put them here, they have no access to mental health services. St. John's [Episcopal Hospital] has a great mental health program, but they're not going to get on a bus to go to St. John's. And if they're veterans, they should go to a VA hospital," said Luhrs, a Beach 120th resident since 2013.

Perez, on the other hand, harbors fears for her autistic child, whose innocence and trusting disposition make him vulnerable to nefarious members of society.

"Where are these people going to go all day?" asked Simon. "I get nervous when they say they they're going to leave during the day. I smell a rotten stinkin' rat."

When asked about possible solutions that would eliminate the threat of an SRO entering the community, Karalis offered one possible strategy of multiple stakeholders joining forces to raise enough funds to entice Fuhrman to sell the property to them. In turn, the local homeowners would look for a more suitable buyer.

Another idea posited by Luhrs was demolishing the mold-infested residence that was last occupied in 2011 and make it a parking lot for locals who must continually contend with a paucity of spaces.

Whether Fuhrman and her neighbors ultimately reconcile and come to a meeting of the minds is anyone's guess at this point.





# Rockaway Resident Makes Good

## Ed Shevlin Goes from Fulbright Scholar to Disaster Relief Specialist

Lifelong Rockaway resident Ed Shevlin has seen it all.

He's gone from rock bottom to earning a Fulbright Scholarship and a litany of other medals and commendations, but Shevlin maintains that his Rockaway roots have helped get him to where he is today.

Born in Peninsula Hospital on September 27, 1960, Shevlin attended St. Francis de Sales for grammar school before going on to Beach Channel High School. He took a job with the NYC Department of Sanitation after graduation but when tragedy struck on September 11, 2001, Shevlin says that something inside him changed.

"In the aftermath of 9/11, my drinking got very dark," Shevlin told The Wave. "Every time I picked up a drink, those feelings I used to get of being jovial and happy were replaced with feelings of revenge, anger, and sadness. It was all negative, and it was really screwing up my life."

Growing concerned about the toll his drinking was having, Shevlin went to his Chief at sanitation and asked to be sent to a rehabilitation center upstate. The chief was impressed with his desire to change and personally drove Shevlin to Veritas Villa, where he stayed for 28 days.

"I had been drinking alcoholically for 28 years, and after that 28-day program I haven't touched a drink in just about 18 years now," Ed said. "Since then, I've dedicated my sober life to the memory of two friends, firefighters who lost their lives in 9/11 – Steve Belson, and Vinny Kane."

That time in recovery gave Shevlin time to pursue a new calling in life, and that pursuit led him to a place he never before thought possible: "In my 15th year at sanitation, I decided to go back to school," he explained. Attending SUNY Empire, Shevlin took an interest in the Irish language and began plans to travel to Ireland to better immerse himself in it.

This interest in the Irish language landed him with the very first Irish Language Summer Study Award from the prestigious Fulbright Program, enabling him to travel to Ireland in 2009.

Shevlin applied, devouring his newfound passion with gusto, and was accepted for a second Irish Language Summer Study Award from Fulbright in 2011. With his skills in the Irish language, Shevlin then went on to win the SUNY Chancellor's Award for Student Excellence from a pool of thousands of other candidates and was accepted into the NYU Glucksman Ireland House on scholarship, where he earned his Master's Degree.

These extraordinary academic achievements were still not enough for Shevlin, however. During a speaking engagement in 2015, Shevlin was approached by members of the New York State Guard and asked to join. At first, Shevlin thought that he might be a bit too old (he was 55 years old at the time) but he soon learned that the NY Guard took recruits until 62.

When asked why he wanted to join at that age, Shevlin said it makes him "part of the solution": "I won't just be a civilian standing on the sidelines. I'll be one of the responders helping to bring relief to the people who are in a bad way."

As a member of the NY State Guard Shevlin excelled just as he had in the academic world. After bootcamp, Shevlin was enrolled as a specialist due to his extensive academic background and joined the Guard's pistol team. Two years later, Shevlin was promoted to sergeant.

In the three-and-a-half years that Shevlin has served, he's managed to garner two commander's citations, two army achievement awards, and the opportunity to serve with relief operations in the aftermath of Hurricane Maria.

Operating out of Camp Smith near Peekskill, NY, Shevlin worked for a month and a half packaging and organizing nearly 4000 containers of supplies and shipping them down to the storm-ravaged island of Puerto Rico.

This ability to help other storm-

affected people had an especially warm place in Shevlin's heart; one of the main reasons he joined the Guard was out of a dedication to his community and a desire to serve.

"In Rockaway, everyone learned the measure of their neighbor in the wake of Hurricane Sandy. You knew that the people who lived next door to you would help you in any way they could," Shevlin said. "By joining the NY Guard I found a way to get that

feeling of being able to help other people we saw after Sandy by helping people across NY."

But Shevlin's desire to help doesn't have any signs of slowing down. Next month, the decorated Guardsman is heading off to Lake Ontario, where he plans to help construct floodwaters and levees to hold back the floodwaters threatening local communities there







# School Scope

#### Democracy, Socialism and the UFT

I've been writing about the variety of brands of socialism and democracy and there are so many interpretations that if you take any one definition of democracy or socialism, you will violate the sensibilities of others: the eye of the beholder syndrome. My

views hang from a bungee cord, bouncing back and forth.

We went to see the enormously popular Freda Kahlo exhibit at the Brooklyn Museum. Kahlo was a lifelong socialist/communist, as was her even more famous husband, Diego Rivera. They hosted Leon Trotsky, one of the key leaders of the Bolshevik Revolution when he lived at their house in Mexico City before an agent of Stalin assassinated him. Trotsky and his followers were purged by Stalin and became the heart of the socialist movement that became increasingly critical of the Soviet system. They claim Stalin hijacked the Bolshevik Revolution and turned their version of communism into an undemocratic state controlled by one strong man.


Trotsky and Trotskyism were viewed by hardcore Stalinists as their major enemy and they persecuted Trotskyists all over the world. Reading George Orwell's works from the Spanish Civil War, which he fought in in the 30s, he was initially sympathetic to the Trotsky point of view as the brigade he joined was under the influence of the Trotsky point of view and came under attack by the Stalinists. Orwell wrote anti-Soviet novels like "1984" and "Animal Farm" and anticommunists often cited him. But so did people on the left and Orwell died a socialist in 1950.

Back to the Kahlo exhibit, there were many photos of her and Trotsky and others. One photo identified a key Trotsky supporter named Max Shachtman who morphed out of Trotskyism in the late 40s and became the leader of a branch of socialism known as "Shachtmanism".

My union, the United Federation of Teachers, which due to the high number of members was organized into a powerful political force in the early 60s. Key organizers of the UFT, led by Al Shanker were socialist-Shachtmanites. Shachtman's wife, Yetta, was a key advisor to Shanker in the UFT for many years.

It is worth exploring this particular brand of socialism in order to better understand the political stances and organizational structure of the UFT which is based on some key concepts of the Leninist branch of socialism, like democratic centralism — which means everyone in the party must go along with the majority publicly or face expulsion. (I will address the complexities of democracy and protection of minority views in the future.)

The UFT's ruling party, Unity Caucus, has been so organized since 1962 and has maintained power since then,



often under the leadership of one strong voice --- which itself undermines the democratic nature of democratic centralism. There have been only 4 UFT presidents since 1964. The recent UFT election was won by Unity with 87% of the vote, the kind of dominance Putin would kill

for (and he probably has.)

Here is a summary from Wikipedia on elements of Shachtmanism:

"In 1958, the Independent Socialist League led by Max Shachtman dissolved to join the Socialist Party of America. Šhachtman had written that Soviet communism was a new form of class society, bureaucratic collectivism, in which the ruling class exploited and oppressed the population and therefore he opposed the spread of communism. Shachtman also argued that democratic socialists should work with activists from labor unions and civil rights organizations to help build a social democratic "realignment" of the Democratic Party. Though he died on November 4, 1972, and had little involvement with the Socialist Party in the year proceeding his death, his followers, identified as "Shachtmanites", exercised a tremendous amount of influence on the party. The party is known as SDUSA and in the early decades to get anywhere in the UFT membership was an important ingredient, but has waned once the old-guard founders of the UFT like Shanker and his successor Sandy Feldman were gone and replaced by more traditional Democratic-like politicians Randy Weingarten and Michael Mulgrew who have never identified themselves as socialists. That original old guard put anti-Communism at the top of their agenda and allied with right-wing forces on many issues, leading the UFT away from its earliest roots while keeping elements rooted in methods of control used in certain socialist parties and organizations. Even today, you will find that the UFT, NYSUT and the AFT pretty much align with the center of the Democratic Party on most issues, especially when it comes to foreign policy and defense spending. Shanker also found alignment with Republicans and Democrats on education reform - which ended up deforming education. After years of going along, the UFT finally began to turn away from ed deform support about a decade ago - and that has led to a current split in the Democratic Party with the Bernie wing taking a stronger stance opposing charter

Can socialism and democracy coexist? I don't have an answer yet but we will keep exploring.

#### PTA of Channel View School for Research (\$1,850; Rockaway Park & Arverne)

PTA of Channel View School For Research is leading swimming and water safety classes for students and parents in response to a student's tragic drowning last year. Faculty and local lifeguards are teaching basic water safety and accident prevention in preparation for the summer and swimming season on the local beaches. Beginning with the student community and their families, the group is increasing awareness and preparedness among the community with hope of expanding programming further in the future.

#### PS 104Q The Bayswater School (\$2,000; Far Rockaway)


P.S. 104Q The Bayswater School is providing their school community the opportunity to learn about the environment and growing healthy food. By planting a large garden, students ranging from kindergarten through fifth grade working with their teachers, parent volunteers, and others from the community are getting first-hand experience with soil, mulch, seeds, and plants. Core subjects like math, literacy, and science are being integrated into the project to create a multidisciplinary setting.

#### **Broad Channel: Jamaica Bay Ecowatchers** (\$3,000; Broad Channel)

Jamaica Bay Ecowatchers is beautifying the entrance of local ballfields as a way to transform the space into a more inviting area. The group is planting flowers and shrubs and engaging residents in weeding and watering throughout the year. Through the project, the group is engaging more residents in an underutilized local green

Breezy Point Garden Club is developing vacant areas of the garden into a native plants garden, aiming to restore the native plant ecosystem largely lost in Hurricane Sandy. Community members are learning about selecting, planting and caring for native plants, participating in gardening competitions and receiving encouragement to use native plants in the private gardens



around newly rebuilt houses. The native plant garden is also providing a space for exploration of the whole ecosystem supported by native plants such as insects and birds native to the area or passing through on their migration path.

"The grassroots groups receiving Neighborhood Grants truly represent the best of New York City. These organizations are doing incredible work to improve the quality of life in neighborhoods across the five boroughs and we are proud to support their efforts. 

# FINANCIAL SHARKTRESS

#### How do you plant the seeds of wealth?

As the gardening season gets into high gear, we may want to plant seeds of wealth alongside with the tomatoes to be able to afford that nice olive oil when it comes time to make the marinara sauce both literally and metaphorically. Technology can help us do that, It can help us commit



to saving and investing! Wouldn't saving and investing be so much easier if you didn't have to think about it, if everything was automated and it just did it on its own? This year don't you consider taking a more holistic approach to your money. The key to growing both wealth and crops is consistency. What is more consistent than automated saving and investing? Plants need to be regularly watered and so too does your bank account.

The first thing that I recommend doing is opening a checking account as well as a savings account, if you don't have them already. Another thing to think about is moving your savings accounts to an online bank. you can use sites to find the best bank for you. My personal favorite is NerdWallet! Make sure that bank you choose is FDIC insured and gives you the best interest rate possible. To put it in perspective, I've made more interest in one month by putting my savings in an online bank than I had made all year in brick and mortar banks! When we think of opening a bank account we think of walking into a concrete establishment. Consider this: Online banks have much lower operating costs than regular banks with storefronts. These banks will often share their savings

er interest rates, no minimum balances, or service fees. It might not seem like a lot, but those few extra dollars can add up to a lot in the long run.

What about investing, you ask. Did you know that you could do the same thing with Investments? For the

average investor it's not about trying to time the markets and buy large quantities of stock when you have the money to do so and the market is right. It's about setting up weekly or monthly automated transfers into your Investments. # Hands Across The Sand To Fight Pipeline

Environmental advocates held hands with like-minded individuals along the shoreline of Beach 69th Street and the boardwalk for 15 minutes to demonstrate opposition to offshore oil drilling.

The protest was held in unison with other protests across the country on Saturday morning, May 18 as part of the "Hands Across The Sand," (HATS), an initiative founded by Surfrider member Dave Rauschkolb.

HATS, along with the NYC Chapter of the Surfrider Foundation, Oceana MidAtlantic, Greenpeace and Rockaway Women For Progress, is in opposition to offshore oil drilling, including the construction of the Williams NESE pipeline.

Despite the NYS Department of Energy Conservation's denial of Williams a water quality permit, temporarily halting the project, the folks who took part in HATS say they must continue to push forward.

"The Williams company has the ability to come back at any given moment and reapply for this water permit," explained Patrick Diamond, Vice Chair of Surfrider NYC. "But we're still pretty excited that the DEC denied it...the letter they've shared stated a pretty strong denial to our case and it gives you the sense that even if the Williams project does come back and reapplies... it's very unlikely that they're going to be able to meet the water quality standards that the state sets here in Rockaway Beach."

"One of the highlights today is walking away knowing we were successful in fighting the Williams pipeline, but keep in mind it's an ongoing fight," said President of Rockaway Women For Progress, Jean Belford. "Although we got two huge wins because of Governor Cuomo's effort to banning drilling in New York waters and a temporary hold off on the Williams project, we must continue to think about the deep ocean and international waters."

After the event, the group gathered at the Rockaway Brewing Company in Arverne for a toast saluting their combined efforts and a pledge to keep fighting for resiliency and recovery.

of the sites has 100,000 square feet of retail. It's a significant amount of retail, and one of the things which, and you're correct, we don't want to do is go back to the Robert Moses era, where Robert Moses just built housing," claimed Richards.

The city legislator further explained that a greater number of people in the community ensures the ample density required to adequately patronize local businesses.

"You go to Mott Avenue now, we walk outside these stores— all of these are pretty much closed, right? There's no walkable traffic out there; there's no one living in the epicenter. There's really not really a nightlife here, right? So, we've now created that nightlife which will then support

Richards proceeded to dispute widespread grumblings on the part of locals citing how an overabundance of low-income residents would ultimately undermine efforts to reinvigorate commercial activity.

To that end, he pointed out that more storefront vacancies exist in DTR than in the Laurelton end of his district, which is generally considered the more affluent neighborhood of the two.

Housing Preservation Development (HPD) Queens and Staten Island Planning & Pre-Development Director Perris Straughter addressed the low-income quandary by breaking down the logic behind the residential makeup of Edgemere's Beach Green Dunes Phase I.

City government, he said, couldn't accept applications from families over the 80-percent AMI (Area Median Income) threshold— excluding residents with annual earnings exceeding \$76,880— given HPD's efforts in staying in line with market rate rental fees in Edgemere.

Added perspective was offered by Richards, who stated: "Let me just touch on this because I'm going to try to be as diplomatic as I can in this conversation about affordable housing. The average AMI for a Rockaway resident is 40 percent from here up to the west. So, we're not going to gentrify my community. Everything we've built so far is for individuals earning \$30,000 or a little bit below up to \$80,000."

An assortment of mass transit and

hang-ups uttered by Norman Silverman were handled by Richards and Department of Transportation (DOT) Queens Commissioner Nicole Garcia, the latter of whom assured the long-time Rockaway transportation advocate that special placards for the disabled are available through her agency.

As for Silverman's gripes over the lack of options in accessing the LIRR, the Councilman announced—to the delight of his constituents on hand that a connection between the A Train and the Long Island-based railroad system is forthcoming. Richards also promised that a full revamp of the 22-A bus line is in the works.

When responding to specific inquiries about the development of the land formerly occupied by the Thriftway Mall on Mott Avenue and Beach 22nd Street, Richards told the crowd that he "anticipates" a gym coming to the site. NYC Department of Design (DDC) and Construction Assistant Director of Intergovernmental and Community Affairs Jessica Douglass expounded on the commercial makeup of the location by reporting that a daycare center will be part of the retail mix as well.

When she broached schools, however, the DDC spokesperson informed that environmental analysis conducted by her team "doesn't indicate a need for additional seats just yet."

Other key matters highlighted at

the meeting included were the danportion of Brookville Boulevard, commonly known as Snake Road which, according to Board Chair of the Joseph Addabbo Healthcare Center Betty Leon, gets constantly flooded during rainy

For years, Snake Road has been used as a shortcut to Rockaway without having to pay the toll on the Cross Bay Bridge. Many locals, such as area civic leader Eugene Falik, agree that the lack of shoulders, curbs, lighting and signage make the emergency evacuation route a dicey alternative for drivers navigating the thoroughfare.

Richards shared that he is collaborating with the DDC on a \$55 million endeavor to augment the safety on Snake Road, but also improve street conditions throughout Far Rockaway. "Legal barriers," he conceded, are delaying that process.

One community leader who endorsed the grand-scale investments spearheaded by Richardsalso comprising new and remodeled park space; new streetscape and sewer infrastructure and a brand new \$30 million library—was CB 14 District Manager Jonathan Gaska.

"I really want to give a lot of credit to the Councilmember. We would not be here today if it was not for him. He is super active. He's really trying to bring money into a district, which some people are not used to on this end of CB14."

to Rockaway in 1989, opening the restaurant after noticing the lack of homemade food options in the community.

"There were two McDonald's, there were one or two Chinese restaurants and there was like Kentucky Fried Chicken. There may have been some pizza shops," she recalls. "I didn't know any Caribbean restaurant that sold barbeque in 1989." Fusing cultures is nothing new for Joan, the daughter of a Japanese immigrant and an Alabama native, and that fusion is what keeps the customers coming back for more.

"Everything is always on demand from everybody," Joan said. Goody's offers classic Caribbean dishes like jerk chicken, curried chicken or goat, and oxtails with rice and peas, but also has American/southern favorites like cheeseburgers, mac & cheese, collard greens, and of course, barbeque chicken. If you stop by at the right time of day, it's worth it to add the fried dumplings. The airy, slightly sweet treat can be eaten alone as an appetizer or along with a dish as a side.

Most people order to go, but they added an outdoor seating area two years ago after Joan noticed that people would be scattered on the sidewalks nearby, eating food they'd just purchased from her restaurant. Although they have no plans to offer delivery, they will adjust their schedule starting June 9th to be open an additional day for the summer season. Until Labor Day, patrons will be able to visit Goody's on Sundays 12 p.m. - 8 p.m.; they'll still be closed on Mondays.

"Summertime used to be a slow season for us because locals would leave Rockaway in the summer," Joan recalled. "They built new things and more and more people started coming during the summer. We had to adapt to the change."

Six blocks down the road, Nicole Russell runs Last Dragon Pizza, a "takeaway" pizza shop inspired by the cult film classic "The Last Dragon." Folks come from all over The Rock to pick up her pizza at Beach 67th Street and Thursby Ave in Arverne, She describes her food as "ethnic pizza," and menu items like "Kiss Mi Converse," a jerk chicken

pizza, and "7th Heaven," an Indianinspired tandoori chicken pie, ensure that she lives up to those expectations. You won't find Bruce Leroy or Sho' Nuff (see the movie, it's a joy, and produced by the legendary Quincy Jones), but you will find the "Sukiy Aki Hot Suki Sue," an Asian barbeque chicken pizza.

As summer approaches, Russell hopes people will try the "Angie Baby," a Sicilian slice topped with anchovies, parmesan, and arugula.

"I love anchovies and I created that pie in case there were people like me," Russell said. "I wish more people ordered it because it's such a great flavor combination."

Last Dragon has been around for the last five years, and every year Russell finds new ways to keep her brand fun and interesting. From collaborating with other local businesses (including our Glorified Tomato, Paula DiGioia, http://bit. ly/2EmjppJ), creating menu items that cater to those with dietary restrictions (she offers a couple of vegan pizzas and recently added a gluten-free cauliflower crust option), Russell continues to raise the bar. This summer she'll be bringing her one-woman pizza operation on the road, with plans to travel throughout the other boroughs and even out of state to collaborate with other businesses. She's also offering catering for private events and has her restaurant on UberEats in case you can't do a pick-up.

Four blocks north of Goody's, you'll find Smoothie Haven, (a fairly new restaurant that does more than just serve healthy food options. Owner Emmanuel "Manny," Loncke opened Smoothie Haven in 2015 due to the lack of healthy restaurants on the peninsula. Loncke is also the president of Arverne by the Bay Community Center, a place where community members can go for family fun, to learn about financial literacy and making better food choices, and community events. The center has been around since 2009, but Haven, located on the building's side, has helped to bring more attention to the community center.

"No one knows what's going on [in this building] until they stop at the smoothie shop," says Loncke.

He added on a new component to the shop a few months ago called Haven Has Wings where he serves "cheat day meals so people can have the option to choose." For those trying to achieve their summer bodies in time, "Real Meal," a meal replacement smoothie, and fruit smoothies named "Brazilian" and "Berry Blitz" are popular menu items among customers. With Haven Has Wings came food specials: empanadas are three for seven dollars and buy one get one free for first-time customers. This summer they'll be testing vegan pizza paninis, burgers, and chicken, as well as introducing an expanded menu of frappes.

Customers directly support the community center when they support Smoothie Haven and Haven

Has Wings. Throughout the year Loncke employs over 50 youth around Rockaway and teaches them about good business practices and financial literacy in addition to preparing and cooking food.

"They learn all these different details so that when they go on to a job interview they know what to do," Loncke said. "Even finances, learning the importance of credit and how it affects your everyday life. It's a principle that they don't teach outside."

Last but not least, the new places at the Tides at Arverne By The Sea are making a name for themselves.

Locals Collective, a newly-designed space ignited by two-man duo Mike "Kook" Kololyan and Mike "Rhino" Reinhardt of surf school Locals, now operate a cutting edge, yet tranquil zone for the community to come together over a steaming cup of coffee.

Reinhardt said the pair are really excited to bring this to the neighborhood because it's been needed for a long time.

"We've lived here our whole lives; my family has resided here for about 100 years actually," said Reinhardt. "We are in our eighth year at our surf school, so we literally watched this area really develop over our lives and through the course of our surf school business, this area was in need of something and we've been eyeing it forever,"

Also making a splash is the newest outlet for Cuisine by Claudette, which unveiled its second location at The Tides, 190 Beach 69th Street on Thursday, May 16, welcoming in the

neighborhood with music and food and inviting locals to take a look around at their newest endeavor.

"We're super excited to finally be opening," said managing partner Yarden Elkaïm-Flatow "There's no way we could be here today without the support of the whole neighborhood. The whole seven years we've been open we've had the whole neighborhood behind us, so we're super grateful for that."

The new spot will be officially opened for business on Friday, May 24-last Thursday's event was just a soft opening-and represents the latest notch in the belt of one of Rockaway's most dedicated businesswomen. Claudette Flatow's journey into the commercial culinary world began with her teaching cooking classes to locals more than two decades ago. After years of teaching, Claudette decided to finally open a store of her own in April 2012.

Unfortunately, that first store, as with so many other locations on the peninsula, was battered by Hurricane Sandy just months after opening. Despite the losses, however, Claudette and her family were determined to rise above the tragedy and she managed to reopen her shop just two months after the storm. Since then, Claudette's has developed into something of a Rockaway institution, and residents across Rockaway were cheering the decision to open a second location in Arverne.

"We're excited to see them move on to bigger and better things," said Bryan Doremus, DJ for the local Rockaway Beach Broadcasting Company.

"We're all really happy to see them get this second location" added Frisco Granda, the sound engineer at RBBC.

Others looked forward to being able to get their favorite meals more

"I'm so glad I can go eat a good lunch no matter where I am now, no matter what part of the peninsula I'm on" said DJ Max Power, remarking on the fact that in addition to the original Claudette's location on 116th, Claudette's also has a stand on the Riis Park boardwalk throughout the summer. In addition to the building that was opened this year, the Tides developers are planning on building seven brand new luxury buildings in the area with one opening each year for the next seven years—and Claudette's is getting in on the ground floor both literally and figuratively!

# **Getting Crabby!**

Crowds of crab lovers flocked to the Jamaica Bay Wildlife Refuge on Sunday, May 19, to celebrate one of the areas must unusual looking creatures – the venerable Jamaica Bay Horseshoe Crab – and to learn about the vital niche that these animals fill in our ecosystem.

"Horseshoe crabs provide food for migrating birds and play an important role in human medicine," Alex Zablocki, Executive Director of the Jamaica Bay-Rockaway Parks Conservancy said. "The Horseshoe Crab Festival allows us the opportunity to engage the public in the importance of these prehistoric creatures, and why we need to protect shorelines where they mate."

In total, more than 120 people made their way down to this year's Horseshoe Crab Festival, where guests were able to observe horseshoe crabs as they came ashore to mate and lay eggs, and also listen to several speakers teach about the ecological and medical importance of these animals.

A film titled "New York City's Oldest Inhabitants: Horseshoe Crabs in Jamaica Bay" was also screened during the festival, and Lisa Schnell, author of the children's book "High Tide For Horseshoe Crabs," was also on hand to lead a children's program throughout the day.

Festivals and the education that these kinds of public events can provide are hoped by many local wildlife advocates to be the key towards reversing the declining horseshoe crab numbers in the area.

"Thirty years ago there were many more horseshoe crabs in Jamaica Bay and other estuaries on Long Island," Don Riepe, Director of the American Littoral Society's Northeast Chapter, told The Wave. "Unfortunately, excess harvesting, wanton killing, and shoreline development has significantly reduced their population. We need to educate more people about the important ecological and medical value of the horseshoe crabs so that they may have better protection in the future."

The medical value of these creatures – which have been in existence for more than 400 million years – comes in large part from their unusual copper-based blood. This blood, which is blue in color due to the copper, has a clotting factor that can detect minute traces of endotoxins and other bacteria which can be harmful to humans. In order to ensure that their environment is free of bacterial contamination, many labs rely upon refined horseshoe crab blood to test their equipment and vaccines prior to use.

In addition to the festival, the American Littoral Society and the JBRPC have also teamed up to launch a YouTube series titled "Explore Jamaica Bay: New York City's Natural Oasis," that allows interested environmentalists to check in at any time to learn more about the rich ecology of the bay.

"The Conservancy is hopeful that with the launch of our new YouTube channel and video on Jamaica Bay's horseshoe crabs, we will be able to educate even more people about their importance and why we must protect them and their habitat" Zablocki explained.

In addition to horseshoe crabs, the "Explore Jamaica Bay" series gives viewers a look at the shorebirds, ospreys, and raptors that call the area home. Each video – produced by Saving Jamaica Bay producer Dan Hendrick – runs about ten minutes and examines a different group of animals that live in the bay and its surrounding area.





# IABHOF announces 2019 inductees

The Irish American Baseball Hall of Fame (IABHOF) has announced its Class of 2019, which includes twotime NL MVP Dale Murphy, Phillies broadcaster Tom McCarthy, Atlanta Braves manager Brian Snitker, former Red Sox ČEO John Harrington, and John Fitzgerald, a founder of The Baseball United Foundation.

The induction ceremony will be held on Friday, June 28, at 12:00 p.m. at Foley's NY Pub & Restaurant (18 W. 33rd St.), home of the IABHOF. Honorees include players, managers, scouts, broadcasters, executives, and entertainers of Irish descent who have impacted the game of baseball in a positive way. The voting is conducted by past honorees and a panel of baseball histo-

Former Player

Dale Murphy: During a career spent mostly with the Atlanta Braves, Murphy won back-to-back NL MVP Awards (1982–83), four Silver Slugger Awards (1982–85), and five Gold Gloves (1982–86).

Media

Tom McCarthy: The announcer has done play-by-play for the Philadelphia Phillies for the past decade. Manager

Brian Snitker: NL Manager of the Year Award for the 2018 season, Snitker has been with the Atlanta Braves since signing as a minor leaguer in 1977 and also served as a minor league manager and coach. Executives

John Fitzgerald: Founder of the Irish Junior National Baseball Team, the first team to win a gold medal for Ireland in international competition and the founder of the Baseball United Foundation, a nonprofit organization that works to advance youth baseball in Ireland andaround the world.

John L. Harrington: CEO of the Red Sox instrumental in assembling the successful Boston teams of the late 1990s and early 2000s. He championed interleague play and the Wild Card playoff format, built the club's spring training facility in Fort Myers and brought the All-Star Game to Fenway Park in 1999.

"This year's class includes one of the best all-around players of the 1980s, the reigning NL Manager of

the Year, an award-winning baseball documentarian, an iconic baseball executive, and one of baseball's best broadcasters," said Shaun Clancy, owner of Foley's Pub, which features one of the country's most extensive public displays of baseball memora-

The Irish American Baseball Hall of Fame will also present its annual Pete Caldera-Duke Castiglione "I Didn't Know You Were Irish Award, which goes to an honoree whose Irish roots are not widely known. This year's honoree is Tyler Tumminia, senior vice president of the Goldklang Group, which owns several professional baseball teams.

New this year is the introduction of the Clive Butterworth Award, which

recognizes outstanding volunteer service to youth and amateur baseball in Ireland. The first award posthumously to the award's namesake, Clive Butterworth, who introduced the game of baseball to Ireland in 1958. He was solely responsible for the growth of youth and adult amateur baseball in Waterford and Dub-

lin for nearly a decade.

With the blessing of the National
Baseball Hall of Fame, Foley's, a popular destination among baseball players, executives, umpires and fans, created the Irish American Baseball Hall of Fame to recognize players, managers, executives, jour-

nalists, and entertainers of Irish descent. Inductees are chosen based on a combination of factors, including impact on the game, popularity on and off the field, contributions to society, connections to the Irish community, and, of course, ancestry.

The game of baseball has welcomed immigrants from its earliest days when an estimated 30 percent of players claimed Irish heritage. Many of the game's biggest stars at the turn of the 20th century were Irish immigrants or their descendants, including Michael "King" Kelly, Roger Connor (the home run king before Babe Ruth), Eddie Collins, Big Ed Walsh and managers Connie Mack and John McGraw.

Shaun Clancy, an amateur baseball historian, created the Hall after learning about the rich heritage of Irish Americans during the sport's infancy. He decided to celebrate his roots and those who helped make the game great by creating a shrine to Irish Americans in baseball in
