The Wave breaks down the candidates running for Queens District Attorney

On Tuesday, June 25, the Democratic primary election for Queens District Attorney will take place. In anticipation, The Wave interviewed all of the candidates on our podcast, and have detailed some of the highlights of each interaction. We've also included a grading system based on analysis from our editorial board.

Greg Lasak is a former Supreme Court judge, spent 25 years as an Assistant District Attorney, becoming Chief of the Homicide Bureau by 30. Also served as Executive Assistant District Attorney. He feels his experience is and should be the deciding factor for any voter.

"The main function of the District Attorney is to keep the public safe," Lasak explained during his interview on "Riding The Wave" the newspaper's podcast. "I really strongly believe you have to have worked in some part of the system, whether it's in the DA's office or as the defense attorney or as a judge, you have to have some hands on experience, because when you walk in to the District Attorney's office, you're walking

into an establishment that handles over 50,000 cases a year and it encompasses attorneys working in I'd say about 18 bureaus, about six divisions on top of that and there's about 340 lawyers working in that office. Having worked at 25 years, I'm familiar with every bureau, most of the personnel there. I know their strengths, I know their weaknesses. I don't see how you can go into that office never having worked either in that office or been in the courtroom - in a criminal courtroom."

Pros: Most qualified candidate, impressive administrative record. Has support of law enforcement

Cons: Represents status quo to some voters, especially to progressives.

Mina Malik is another qualified candidate, who has served in a wide variety of roles. Criminal investigator at the D.C. Public Defender Service, Special Counsel to the Brooklyn District Attorney, Executive Director of the New York City Civilian Complaint Review Board, as well as Deputy Attorney General for the District of Columbia. Malik also has prosecutorial experience, having worked as a Special Victims prosecutor in Queens.

"What sets me apart is that I have been on both the defense side as well as the prosecution's side ... It is extremely important to have street credibility when you walk into the Queens DA's office on day one. You need to know what you're doing. You need to have experience in criminal justice. You need to have experience in criminal justice reform. Everybody in this race right now is talking about criminal justice reform, but nobody has actually implemented it. I'm the only one who has.

Grade: A

Pros: Also very experienced, great resume, also has administrative experience.

Cons: Despite being an excellent communicator, media has been lukewarm.

Lancman is a NYC Rory Councilman. He was an attorney in private practice before becoming an elected official. He chairs the committee that has oversight over all five NYC District Attorneys. When asked if

his lack of prosecutorial experience is an obstacle, he chuckled.

"First, let's understand that I've been a lot more than a politician, or as I prefer, a public official. For most of my adult life, I was a practicing lawyer as a civil litigator in state and federal court .. You need to have substantial legal experience. You need to have substantial public policy experience and you need to have a demonstrated record on the things that you say you're going to do .. That's what I bring to the table. Substantial legal experience, substantial policy making experience and the certainty in the mind of the public that the things that I say I'm going to do, because I've done them."

Pros: Legal expert, administrative experience. Very confident.

Cons: No prosecutorial experience, career politician, adversarial relationship with law enforcement

Melinda Katz is a favorite of many in Rockaway. As Queens Borough President, she has been very effective in her leadership of the most diverse bor-



What A Disgrace

Thousands heard the call.

There were the first responders who survived that dark day when the towers fell and thousands were murdered by terrorists. Soon, they were joined by rescue and recovery workers hard hats and other members of the community. They came from across America and around the world, to lend a hand at Ground Zero; to help a city and a

Yet, in return, many of those brave souls who have died and others facing a similar death sentence for their selflessness and resolve, perseverance and courage. Men and women who initially searched for survivors, then for the recovery of remains of the fallen, exposed themselves to toxic debris caused by fires that burned for 100 days.

Many are sick, many have developed cancer and deadly respiratory diseases, and more than 2,000 deaths have been attributed to 9/11 illnesses. Some experts believe that the death toll for first responders will soon eclipse those who died on 9-11.

Now, the ones who survive are forced to come to the government -- hat in hand -for help.

What a disgrace.

Now, we aren't particularly fond of Hollywood types offering their opinions on the controversy of the day, as the words are often vapid

social media-driven platitudes. However, this past week, former host of The Daily Show, Jon Stewart, eviscerated Congress for its failure to fund to the September 11th Victim Compensation Fund past 2020 at a House Judiciary Committee hearing on reauthorizing

the September 11th Victim Compensation Fund. "Behind me, a filled room of 9/11 first responders. And in front of me, a nearly empty Congress. Sick and dying, they

brought themselves down here to speak to no one," growled Stewart.

This was no fake outrage, no partisan posturing. This was passion. Perhaps the bad publicity will force the GOPcontrolled Senate -- the House of Representatives is

expected to pass the bill easily -- to abandon its ridiculous holding up of the funding.

What a disgrace.

Stewart has fought harder than most for the families of 9-11 victims. He was also at the

May 30 dedication of the Memorial Glade at Liberty and West streets, honoring those first responders who have died after being at Ground Zero.

Absent was from the service was Presidental candidate Bill de Blasio, who spent that morning at Colson Patisserie and the Park Slope Y. Oh, Bill's been paying lip service to the 9-11 fund but didn't see fit to direct the city to donate any money to the Glade memorial. As for his absence, he blamed his staff (again), saying

he didn't know about the service because they didn't tell him about it. If this excuse was even slightly believable or amusing, we'd throw a George Constaza line in here. Bill's branzino buddy Governor Andrew Cuomo didn't show up for the event either, but

his response to the criticism: "You know, we supported that memorial, I think we gave them \$500,000, is that right?" isn't exactly the passionate kind of rhetoric what you'd expect from a leader from New York, especially one who grew up in New York City.

With these two "New York" guys setting the example, maybe we shouldn't be so surprised that so many failed to show for the 9-11 hearing.

What a disgrace.

From the lawyer's briefcase

Can you win more money at trial?

A construction worker was injured when he fell removing paint and applying liquid primer to the outside of a building undergoing renovation work.

There was a large pipe scaffold that spanned more than ten stories, and he was directed by his

foreman s to where to go and perform the work.

On the day of his accident, the worker was told to perform work in the corner of the building on the fifth floor. He carried the liquid primer in a container on his back.

He was not tied off or in any other way secured to the scaffold as he needed to move from location to location to perform this work.

After working for several hours, he had to access to a portion of the wall that did not have a scaffold platform in the vicinity. The worker climbed on the pipes to get next to the wall. As he was moving along the pipes, he slipped and fell approximately eight feet down to a lower level.


As a result of this accident, the worker sustained serious injuries that required surgery on his ankle, wrist, and lower back.

The worker sued the owner of the premises under Labor Law 240, which protects construction workers from gravity-related risks, such as falling from a height or being struck by a falling object.

Liability under this section is governed by statute and construction site owners and general contractors can be held strictly liable for violations. The plaintiff's comparative fault cannot be considered, which makes this statute very plaintiff friendly.

The defendant moved to dismiss the case, arguing that the worker's actions were the sole cause of his injuries. A Labor Law defendant can argue that they are not liable for a plaintiff's injuries, if the plaintiff's actions were the only reason the accident occurred.

Here, the defendant argued that it was the worker's decision to go onto the pipes. The defendant argued that



The worker opposed the motion, arguing that the owner violated Labor Law 240 by failing to erect railings on the bracket scaffold, and by failing to

provide the worker with a lifeline or other proper anchorage to tie off a safety harness.

The worker used all of the safety devices provided to him. He also testified that there was no protection from falling off the edge of the platform and pipes.

The worker also pointed to the testimony of his employer, who stated that they only provided workers with safety lines when they erected and removed scaffolding.

He also testified that when the workers are wearing their protective rain gear, which the worker was wearing at the time of his accident, it is too bulky to fit a harness over.

Accordingly, the worker argued that he could not be the sole cause of his accident when the owner's failure to provide him with proper protection, as required by Labor Law 240, was at least a cause of his accident.

The Court held that questions of fact existed as to the cause of the worker's accident and the case proceeded to

At trial, the jury found that the owner erected the scaffold in an unsafe manner. The jury awarded the plaintiff \$8.4 million in damages.





OATH Helps Residents With Summonses

The New York City Office of Administrative Trials and Hearings (OATH) made their way to Downtown Far Rockaway on the morning of June 12 to help residents get informed about summonses.

In partnership with Councilman Donovan Richards, OATH brought their services to Far Rockaway's temporarily relocated library as part of their "Resource" initiative, which is part of the first-ever collaboration between a government agency and the public library.

Residents from Far Rockaway and Laurelton could stop by, give their name or address (for home and business owners), and find out about any summonses they may have from government agencies like the Department of Sanitation, New York Police Department, and Department of Environmental Protection. The NYPD most often gives summonses for being in a public park after dark, littering, public urination, open alcoholic containers, and excessive noise.

According to OATH representative Marisa Senigo government agencies in NYC issue over 850,000 summonses per year.

Every month OATH Resource hosts events like these in addition to pop-up courts, where they bring OATH hearing officers and resolve open cases. Pop-up courts are more popular since the process to reach them is much easier: OATH representatives reach out to those who have open warrants within certain agencies via mail and request their presence. Those who did decide to stop by their table in the library often left saying "that's good to know" after learning about their summons record.

"A lot of times they're unfair," said resident Alice Louie. She received a summons after accidentally putting a small amount of paper in her bottle recycling, something she considers a small infraction in comparison to those who don't recycle at all. "I am so diligent, I do everything I'm supposed to do and then they have the nerve to do things like this."

If a summons isn't answered within the first two years of receiving it, it becomes nearly impossible to get a

hearing to resolve it. The purpose of this satellite office is to help prevent that from happening.

"We want to ensure due process and empower the residents and owners of the city," said OATH representative John Castelli. "We're at the library because it's somewhere people go to get information. We want to inform."

OATH will host their next event, "Outreach on the Beach," during the last week of July. Join their newsletter (https://www1.nyc.gov/site/oath/about/oath-newsletters.page) to stay informed about upcoming events.



NYC World Oceans Day

Hundreds voyaged to Rockaway Beach on a beautiful Sunday at Beach 94th Street to participate in a global beach clean up hosted by 4Ocean and others. It was a celebration of the June 9 United Nations' World Oceans Day.

Organizations like Peace Boat, a Japan-based international NGO, Global Citizen, The Explorers Club and Jamaica Bay-Rockaway Parks Conservancy (JBRPC) to name a few, were all encouraging the same message to every individual: keep pursuing the need to keep our shared ocean clean and raise awareness about the pivotal role the ocean plays in our lives on a daily basis.

Actively removing plastic waste by the pound, 4ocean founder's Alex Schulze and Andrew Cooper established their global ocean cleanup company in South Florida in 2017. Operating the vastly-growing sensation alone, the pair funded its group entirely by the sale of their products, particularly the bracelets which are made by ocean-based materials.

"With every bracelet purchased we remove one pound of trash from the ocean," Cooper told The Wave. "It's a very cool way where anybody, any-

where in the world can connect and actively help clean the ocean. We pay full time employees to clean the ocean but all the trash being collected today is voluntarily pulled so it doesn't go towards the one pound pledge."

The idea was born out of a surf trip the pair took to Bali, Indonesia, witnessing the devastating amount of plastic exposed to an old fishing village. That experience would change their perspective, and they decided to take matters into their own hands. "We saw how much plastic pollution there was on their beaches and at the time, we didn't know the problem was that bad," explains Cooper. "Once we got exposed to that we were like 'okay we have to do something,' and we always wanted to start a brand and the two puzzles pieces just started to fit and we've obviously been so hyperfocused on cleaning the ocean...our act two is to educate people on land so that we don't have to clean the ocean."

According to Cooper, much of the

trash exposed to the ocean are from consumers, especially from single-use plastic.

On Sunday, the group — made up from people from small island states as far as Tuvalu and Fiji shared their experiences of three oceans; the Indian, Pacific and the Atlantic.

Special guest speaker, United Nations Under-Secretary-General for Legal Affairs and Legal Counsel of the United Nations, Mr. Miguel de Serpa Soares, made a short speech before the day wrapped up.

"When we came here I thought 'this beach is already clean, what do we have to do?' but as we started digging under the branches and such I noticed some trash that we were totally unaware of," said Soares. "I look at all of you as fellow ocean caretakers...but let's make sure that ocean day is all year round...not only one day or one week this is very important to raise awareness but the work has to remain all throughout the year."

Make Your Credit Cards Work for You

Bathhouse Revamp Detailed at CB14

A National Parks Service (NPS) spokesperson clued in attendees at Community Board 14's Jun. 11 meeting on a forthcoming major rehabilitation of the Jacob Riis art deco bathhouse.

While the current owners of the Riis Park Beach Bazaar (RPBB)-Belvy Klein and Aaron Broudo- have spearheaded a few temporary operations in the bathhouse, according to NPS Superintendent Jennifer T. Nersesian, future plans call for a much larger investment in the historic brick structure.

The eye-catching edifice, as described by Klein during his presentation at the Tuesday-night marathon session, will ultimately feature multiple restaurants, a few outdoor kiosks, a pool, a 28-room hotel, a rooftop dining establishment, a catering hall on the second floor and event space on the eastern end of the courtyard.

Broudo noted that RPBB has already hosted three weddings in the "massive" courtyard area.

"Our goals are historic preservation, serving the visitor and elevating the recreational experience at Riis," stated Nersesian. "These guys are talking about making a \$30 million investment over the coming decade that I hope is something that can help benefit us all."

In response to CB14 member John Cori's inquiries about NPS strategies to mitigate beach erosion, Nersesian explained that the federal agency is working closely with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers to design a plan to address sand replenishment and other resiliency measures down the road.

Other board members who questioned the agency rep included Lou Caucig, who asked if a new amphitheater at Riis Park would be part of the long range renovations of the bustling oceanside hub. The Neponsit resident partially based his informal proposal on the area's vast parking capacity of 9,000 vehicles and how putting in a new entertainment venue would perhaps better utilize unused space.

Nersesian was doubtful of anything new being constructed at the federally protected destination site given how it's laden with numerous his-

toric overlays.

In fact, she pointed out that the resident parking lot is very close to full on busy visitation days that would further necessitate maintaining the existing spots.

During the Q&A, Klein also updated locals on how he's become more familiar with community needs over the five years that he and his partner have been the RPBB proprietors.


"When we started out, we didn't know what to expect. The majority of the staff was made up of Brooklyn people because that's where we're based. Quickly we learned within a couple of weeks that was not the way to go," he shared, as he continued to notify the crowd of how Rockaway people now comprise about 98-percent of his work force,

which drew a round of cheers and applause.

"There will be many more jobs, and any of you can come by on a weekend and see maybe kids working who are your neighbors, friends or whatever. But we're here for the long haul."

On or about June 25, 2019, the New York City Office of Management and Budget (NYCOMB) anticipates submitting a request to the U. S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) for the release of Community Development Block Grant - Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) funds authorized by the "Disaster Relief Appropriations Act, 2013" (Public Law 113-2) to undertake the implementation of the National Flood project, in the boroughs of Brooklyn, Queens, and Staten Island, in New York City, as part of the Resiliency Innovations for a Stronger Economy (RISE) program.

The New York City Economic Development Corporation (NYCEDC) proposes to install National Flood Sandwich Plate System The New York City Economic Development Corporation (NYCEDC) proposes to install National Flood Sandwich Plate System (SPS) flood panels at up to ten proposed project sites. For the purposes of this project, the SPS flood panels are deployable modular flood barriers targeted at preventing water penetration into buildings and resisting impacts from floating debris. Typical SPS flood panels that would be installed at the proposed project sites would have the following elements: panels which can be manually stacked, supporting structure to restrain the panels, clamping and locking mechanisms, and seals. Together, these components would prevent water penetration into buildings, and would be sufficiently robust to resist impacts from floating debris. SPS flood panels would, therefore, improve resiliency by ensuring that a building's critical functions remain operational during a flood event, and by preventing damage to the building caused by flooding. Prior to installation at a proposed project site, an initial assessment would be conducted to determine appropriate locations for placement of the SPS flood panels, on the exterior of each building. In addition to receiving SPS flood panels, Hook Enterprises LLC, located at 585 Bay Street in Staten Island, would also receive a sewer backflow prevention system. Flooding of sanitary sewers during storms can cause sewage to back up through drain pipes, causing health hazards and in some cases, costly removal of wastewater. Backflow preventers are installed at sewer connections to prevent sewers from backing up into buildings during flooding events. Estimated CDBG-DR funding for the proposed project would total \$2,197,546.

In accordance with 24 CFR Part 58.35 of the HUD Environmental Review Procedures for HUD funded activities, the implementation of the proposed project has been determined to be categorically excluded from the Environmental Assessment requirements of the National Environmental Policy Act. Those wishing to comment should specify which part of this Notice they are addressing.

RELEASE OF FUNDS

NYCOMB certifies to HUD that Melanie Hartzog in her capacity as Certifying Officer of the CDBG-DR Program consents to accept the jurisdiction of the Federal Courts if an action is brought to enforce responsibilities in relation to the environmental review process and that these responsibilities have been satisfied. HUD's approval of the certification satisfies its responsibilities under NEPA and related laws and authorities, and allows NYCOMB to use CDBG-DR funds.

OBJECTIONS TO RELEASE OF FUNDS

ough in NYC. She's been able to create relationships on both sides of our challenging peninsula, and has been a champion of many core Rockaway issues. However, like Lancman, Katz has never prosecuted a case.

"The DA is all about trust and the DA is all about faith. You can only tell if someone's going to do by the experience you've had with them," said Katz. "As the Borough President, I have forged very, very strong relationships because some of the day I got elected, my office has been responsive. I have been responsive, and I will continue that as the District Attorney."

Grade: A-

Proven Pros: leadership, proven advocacy for Queens, and a great communicator.

Cons: No prosecutorial experience, career politician

Jose Nieves has worked as a prosecutor for the Brooklyn DA as well as the New York State Attorney General's office Special Investigations and Prosecutions Unit.

"Growing up in a tough neighborhood. I've seen what violence can do. It can tear apart families. It can tear apart communities," he said. "I've got skin in the game. I have a 13-year-old son and a 16-year-old daughter who have to take the bus to school every day. So, I want to make sure that they're safe. They come home every day and they're fine. So, I want public safety - the core function of the District Attorney's office is to secure and provide public safety for the people of Queens. And that's where I'm going to focus on."

Grade: A

Pros: Military service in a leadership role, has been a prosecutor, community advocacy

Cons: Like Malik, media has mostly ignored his campaign.

Tiffany Cabán has no experience as a prosecutor, has never run an office, and outside of an endorsement from Alexandria Ocasio-Cortez and dozens of progressive organizations. However, she might be the leading candidate if you listen to some of the media experts. When asked about how many feel that politics, not policy has shaped this race, she replied.

"I don't know if I quite understand but I think the way that I would kind of engage with it and approach it is, it's an elected position, right? In so many ways you can't separate our justice system and our District Attorney's offices from housing, healthcare, and education," said Cabán. "I think in some ways that engaging those conversations may make it seem political on its face. But when you really look at it, all of these things are so deeply intertwined in terms of what we allow into our criminal justice system."

Betty Lugo is a fighter and has been for much of her career. She has worked in the Manhattan District Attorney's office, worked as an ADA in Nassau County and is a founding member of Pacheco and Lugo, PLLC, the first Hispanic women owned law firm in New York. During our interview, she made it pretty clear of what she thinks about the politics of this

"Melinda Katz hasn't practiced law, Lancman [hasn't prosecuted cases], Mina Malik, she's not qualified to run this office. Jose [Nieves], I mentored him. Nice young man, but he's not qualified. He doesn't have the qualities that I have to handle this. Tiffany? C'mon give me a break. She wants to let everybody out of jail."

Cons: Not much of a media following, didn't run active campaign



A New Today At Ocean Bay

Luminaries and locals gather to celebrate the completion of country's largest RAD conversion.

After Superstorm Sandy, the Ocean Bay Apartments had no working elevator. No running water. No electricity. Now, after a \$560 million redevelopment, the 24-building, 1,395-unit public housing complex has been transformed, while retaining its longterm affordability.

On June 10, New York State Homes and Community Renewal, the US Department of Housing and Urban Development, New York City Housing Authority, RDC Development (a joint venture between MDG Design+

Construction and Wavecrest Management) and partners held a ribbon cutting to celebrate the completion of NYCHA's first and the country's largest single-site conversion under HUD's Rental Assistance Demonstration.

Councilman Donovan Richards has long been a big proponent of the RAD program, and he said after extensive research and community engagement, it became clear that the fastest way to improve Ocean Bay Houses and provide residents with the safe, decent homes they deserve.

"Since the first day MDG and Wavecrest took over, it was clear that residents would finally receive long overdue repairs and a vast improvement of quality of life, which has been sorely lacking for NYCHA residents," said Richards. "Tenants who have suffered for years living in dilapidated conditions, now have completely remodeled apartments that they are proud to invite friends and family over

Longtime Ocean Bay resident Bridie Wheeler agreed.

"I never imagined that my quality of life could improve as much as it has since the RAD program was initiated here," said Wheeler, Chairwoman of Ocean Bay Community Development Corporation, who has lived in the development for 35 years. "I am so happy to be a part of this demonstration pro-

First built in the early 1960s, Ocean Bay was in desperate need of repair after Sandy, from in-unit renovations to the major rehabilitation of building infrastructure. Completed in just two years, the phased restoration process allowed for all tenants to remain living in their homes throughout the renovations.

"The redevelopment of Ocean Bay started with the task of utilizing RAD on NYCHA units in an unprecedented way, and it is completed as a shining example of how collaboration and ingenuity can transform affordable housing, enhance the lives of nearly 4,000 people, create job opportunities, improve access to social service programs, and increase the safety of the

Candidates Bring DA candidates make candidates make their case to the community

Five of the seven candidates for Queens District Attorney engaged in a public debate at Mt. Carmel Baptist Church on June 10.

Tiffany Cabán, Rory Lancman, Betty Lugo, Mina Malik, and Jose Nieves debated on topics ranging from prosecuting bad cops and elected officials, opinions on cash bail and their plans to eradicate police brutality. The District Attorney has the power to prosecute cases, litigate appeals and offer plea deals to defendants.

Senator James Sanders Jr. gave the opening remarks for the debate, which was led by Sanders' representative Lisa George and moderated by Elaine Short, the president of the Far Rockaway branch of the NAACP. Members of the Rockaway Youth Task Force served as timekeepers throughout the

"Short of the presidency, I would argue that this is the most important race," said Sanders, encouraging the audience to gather their family and friends and bring them to the polls on June 25. He took a moment to draw attention to missing candidates Melinda Katz and Greg Lasak and advised the community to take their absence into consideration when they go to the

The debate kicked off with a question about how the candidates feel about prosecuting officers and/or elected officials. All present candidates stated that they would have no problem prosecuting bad cops and crooked officials, and recognized the corruption that exists in the NYC justice system.

Lugo asked the crowd if they've seen the popular Ava DuVernay-produced Netflix docuseries titled When They See Us, which is about five Black teens who were falsely convicted of raping a woman in Central Park in 1989. In talking about the movie, she addressed the corruption that the New York Police Department is "known

for" and vowed to set up a special unit in order to combat it from the top.

Cabán went so far as to say that she wouldn't even accept prosecutions from officers with a history of bad be-

All candidates agreed that there is a severe imbalance in arrests of people of color for crimes at all levels of offense. In response to a question about keeping communities of color safe from police misconduct, Malik vowed that she would decriminalize what she identifies as the three root causes of crime: poverty, mental health issues, and people with substance use disor-

"We should be making sure that they are getting the treatment and the

services that they need and that they deserve as opposed to incarcerating them," Malik said.

All candidates said they felt the same when it came to cash bail: they won't ask for it in any of their prosecutions. Being unable to pay cash bail for

low-level offenses is a primary reason why many remain behind bars at jails like Rikers Island. What started as a way to ensure someone would return to the court has turned into a way to keep jail attendance high.

"You're in a system where there's a presumption of innocence, and since it is a presumption of innocence, you shouldn't be in jail because you can't afford to pay \$5,000 or \$1,500 or even \$500," said Lancman. "It's wrong. It's an injustice."

During the cash bail segment, the possibility of a community court in Rockaway was brought up by Lugo and Lancman.

You guys have to go all the way to Kew Gardens to answer warrants,' said Lugo. "I'm surprised that there's no community court here like there is in Harlem and Red Hook. That's not

"I'm very optimistic that in this year's budget we're going to have \$1.6 million to start the foundation to form a community court in the Rockaways," said Lancman, to which the audience cheered on in support.

While answering a question about how they would handle instances of excessive and/or deadly force used by police and correctional officers, each nominee explained how they have already been doing this kind of work in their careers and would continue to keep fighting against it.

Nieves stated that he has been holding law enforcement accountable for the past six years and laid out his

plans to form a civil rights unit that would specifically address police mis-

"Predominantly, the victims of that crime are black people, people from our community, people who look like us. That's the problem," Nieves said. "We're not recognizing it as a civil rights issue as we should."

During a segment featuring questions from the audience, Lancman, a self-proclaimed advocate for closing Rikers Island, announced that he was in support of a proposed plan to open five new detention facilities in order to replace the closing Rikers Island.

"If you're serious about closing Rikers Island then the other half of that is you need to build smaller jails in the communities," he told the audience, who didn't seem too keen on that plan. "I believe that every person on Rikers Island has the right to be close to home so that their family can visit them so that the lawyers can visit them. So they're not on an island somewhere forgotten."

Something that casts a giant shadow has considerable influence, and as the slow, but purposeful transformation of Beach 116th Street continues, we wanted to chat with Seth Caller from The Marcal Group. Seth is the head of Acquisitions, Leasing, and Sales for TMG, and The Wave is of the opinion that the development of One Sixteen and other properties that his group is involved with is going to a game-changer for Rockaway.

Mark C. Healey: Clearly, as The Wave wrote in our special Sandy anniversary issue "Surviving And Thriving" in October, 2018, Compass / The Marcal Group believes in the future of Rockaway. Aside from One Sixteen, what other things have happened since to convey that same confi-

Seth Caller: The city has put in a massive amount of money to improve the boardwalk, the beach, and the ferry service. The Rockaways have drawn interest from other residential developers. There is a new hotel going up at West 108th, and a couple of other mixed-use projects further west. The Marcal Group recently purchased Community House on Beach 102nd Street and is building another residential property for the site. We see this whole area becoming a very successful and popular beachside community. I'm glad to see that the



original, essential character of the neighborhood has been maintained by the new growth.

MCH: People ask me the same thing every time we talk about One Sixteen, what about parking?

SC: We try to appeal to a wide range of buyers and anticipate that most of our residents will have cars. We will have enough parking for each buyer plus additional spots for the retail. Some residents also come in on the train and the ferry which is conveniently located just down the street from the project.

MCH: I've heard more than a few of the people that you've dealt with since starting the One Sixteen project, particularly Yarden Flatow from Cuisine by Claudette, say you've been good neighbors. That's not the usual rhetoric one hears about new developers. Is it accurate? Why and how have you been able to build those kinds of rela-

SC: That has been accurate since our very first project. We want to be good neighbors, and we've intentionally made that part of our company culture. Besides the money we've put into One Sixteen, we're committed to the neighborhood. We've co-sponsored some of the events for the Rockaway Business Alliance. We also take the time to listen to local residents and we try to minimize our disruption as much as possible. The community wants to see growth and understands what we're doing is going to continue the positive changes already happening in the area.

The Rockaways is a small community, and people who live there love it. Every single detail and decision matters. People here truly care for one another. As an investor, we feel we should do the same.

MCH: What are the three biggest factors that make One Sixteen a great

SC: First, the Rockaways is a wonderful place to raise a family, removed from the craziness of the city, but still easily accessible. The city has put money into infrastructure and improved transportation, which made Beach 116 a great opportunity to us as a developer. We see the immediate opportunity of buying a home in the Rockaways and the potential long-term gains of this exciting neighborhood.



Second, we try to add value to the neighborhood by giving a lot of thought to every aspect of the project. For example, we have a lot of interest from different types of retailers for our retail spaces, but we're very particular in who we consider. It's not about renting at the highest dollar per foot, we care more about creating a neighborhood and having commercial tenants to match the story that we're helping to write for this area. We want to bring in retail that's exciting and desirable.

Third, the Marcal Group has a longstanding history of investing in communities on the rise. We saw the enormous potential in Williamsburg and Bed Stuy and invested in residential projects there early on. We see the Rockaways as another emerging neighborhood with lots to offer, and are really excited about what the future will bring.

race (his perspective) or allow others

to suppress race from the conversa-

tion, which neither The Wave nor the

people cited in its editorial have done. Let's be clear on the facts here: The Wave did not say race is a taboo subject; it said Mr. Taylor's assertion that people oppose the Peninsula Hospital Site Redevelopment (PHSR) plan because they don't want "too many black and brown folks" in Rockaway was unfounded and divisive. If you have facts that demonstrate racist motivations by the community leaders who expressed concerns about the developer's plan, put them on the

table. Otherwise, The Wave's charac-

terization is accurate. Does that mean we shouldn't talk about race? Of course not. While I disagree that race is "half of the problem," it is salient. Indeed, one could argue the proposed PHSR plan reinforces racism since it will trap the largely black population of these towers (and their children) in almost inescapable poverty. Projects like this enrich the developer and enable politicians to claim false victories; they also worsen the structural disadvantages poor people (often black, more often Hispanic or Asian, sometimes white) struggle to overcome.

All New Yorkers have a stake in fixing the system. Mr. Taylor makes the case that only people from Edgemere should be involved in the discussion about the PHSR. Local voices rightly

carry a lot of weight in Rockaway, as is evidenced by the way Community Board 14 members determine their votes. However, the 327 neighborhoods in the City aren't fiefdoms. They are part of what Mayor Dinkins called a "gorgeous mosaic." We need to work together, especially here in Rockaway where artificial divisions have diluted our unity and our power.


Mr. Taylor makes an excellent point about the need for the voices of people who are "marginalized" to be heard. However, in a healthy community this is rarely an us-against-them proposition. Right here in Rockaway, history has proven that people from different neighborhoods can work together to make sure everyone has an equal seat at the table. If we work together, we can also use our collective brainpower to envision creative, proactive civic solutions and to promote them with one strong Rockaway voice.

For too long our community has succumbed to divide-and-conquer tactics. When it comes to the Peninsula Hospital site, everyone in Rockaway wants a plan that will be beneficial to our community in the long run. However, if we divide ourselves or let politicians play us off each other, all of Rockaway will lose... none more so than the disadvantaged citizens the Rockaway Youth Task Force strives to serve.




3 books, 1 weekend





Rowdy groups, dog poop among top issues at Hammel Houses Cop meet

A general lack of lighting had some public housing residents fuming at the Jun. 12 100th Precinct Sector A NCO meeting, as complaints of loitering and vandalism by local youngsters were cited.

"It's disgusting," lamented one community member from the 81-05 Hammel Houses building, while advising officers of young adults who reportedly play their music at high volumes inside the lobby and hallway areas of her edifice.

Lately, she added, the individuals in question have taken to "tearing up" mailboxes as well.

Another tenant from the 84-12 building partook in the gripe fest, as she communicated that a number of youths—many of whom don't reside on the NYCHA (New York City Housing Authority) development—frequently engage in drinking beer and breaking glass outside her main entrance.

She identified a paucity of lighting as the cause for the disruption. In fact, the darkness permeating the perimeter of the 84–12 site, according to PO Reynaldo Candelaria, is due to ongoing construction inside the village-like complex that has forced mobile lighting fixtures to be relocated.

PO Lauren Haber, the precinct's

crime prevention officer, acknowledged how poor lighting could be emboldening groups of teens/adolescents to congregate in those spots. To that point, she shared how some of her own research on the matter that revealed how large 10' high lamps have proven to be particularly effective in reducing crime on NYCHA grounds.

Both Candelaria and NCO Sgt. Sean Turner assured residents that they will collaborate with NYCHA maintenance crews in ensuring that the mobile fixtures are covering the darker portions of the property.

Other items addressed at the Buildthe-Block session included a dilemma that is near and dear to those who live, work or frequent Rockaway Beach: dog poop.

"A big thing that's going on here, people just let their dogs out, they take a poop wherever, and then you come out and step on it-that's not a good feeling," remarked Candelaria, who told listeners about a man he issued a summons to a day earlier for that very reason.

The adult perpetrator, he said, feigned ignorance about local dog curb-

ing laws and justified his actions by claiming that he does it "all the time."

The Sector A officer also reminded attendees that barbecuing isn't allowed within the confines of NYCHA housing. The only time when the activity isn't prohibited, he stated, is on Hammel's Day, which occurs once a year in August.

"NYCHA will allow for you to go to that one specific designated area to barbecue—it's not a free-for-all. You don't go around, you don't go barbecue in front of your buildings, in the back of buildings or on sidewalks. I've seen it done inside the hallway."

On a more serious note, Candelaria cautioned civilians about recent crimes taking place in and around the 81-03 location. In a recent incident, a male was shot in the arm outside of the building.

"It turns out, he had a firearm as well. He was placed under arrest. If you guys see something, reach out, grab a phone and call 911. Help us help the community."



New York's waterways are wilder than you may think, and every year, the World Science Festival challenges people to detect what's lurking in the underwater world in locations nearby that often go unnoticed.

In collaboration with the Rockaway Waterfront Alliance (RWA), The Great Fish Count was organized in part with the Lamont-Doherty Earth Observatory (LDEO), the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC), with support by the Benzos Family Foundation and held at Dubos Point Wildlife Sanctuary in Arverne on Saturday, June 1, where dozens of curious folks came by to help keep record of what species of fish and other creatures can be caught, identified and then released for observation and educational purposes.

It has been stated that there are 225 species of fish alone found in the Harbor and Hudson ecosystem and some of the most common caught during the count were Atlantic silversides, Northern pipefish, flounders, blue crabs and even a rare unidentified forest green fish.


"We just wanted to bring a little bit of nature back to parts of New York City where maybe children and adults don't think that there is a lot of species of wildlife hidden because there actually is," explained Brett Aresco, site manager of WSF. "This is occurring in all five boroughs from sites located in Upper Queens, Staten Island and the Bronx where we're able to set these nets up and show people from all around the biodiversity that they won't necessarily get the chance to see on a daily basis."

"The whole New York Harbor is part of the excretory system meaning that the freshwater from the Hudson River meets the saltwater from the Atlantic Ocean," said Juli Schroeger, RWA Youth Program Coordinator. "So where we are right now in Jamaica Bay is a brackish water system which is a mix between salty and fresh so we're one of the furthest south of southernmost sites of the great fish count today, and that means we're probably mostly going to have saltwater species. Jamaica Bay alone is a very unique and diverse environment because we get animals from the ocean who are saltwater animals and then we get saltwater species from the bay of the surrounding rivers.'

Early June is also breeding month for horseshoe crabs and diamondback terrapins turtles, so the RWA staff encourages locals to be cognitive of how to handle them if they must get involved in an act of emergency or relocating them back to the water and off the roads. As the day continued, the RWA staff took two volunteers each at a time into the shallow depths of the bay to teach them how to properly net and handle their findings of the day. The Queens Public Library was also on hand, taking water from

the sea and measure oxygen levels and look at it from a microscope perspective.

Spotlight On ElderLaw

At Brady & Marshak, LLP, our practice is focused on the legal issues of "middle class" New York residents. Many of our clients are homeowners and have reasons to protect the value of their homes, which, is often the most valuable asset owned. As middle- class homeowners, we have all struggled to build equity in our homes-whether we are first-time homeowners just starting out, or homeowners who have finally paid off the mortgages, having lived in the home for many years. We all want to prevent our homes' value from being lost to the costs and delays of probate, or from long term care costs (home care and/or care in a facility) due to prolonged illness.

One means to protect the value of the home from the cost and delays associated with probate is a Revocable Living Trust. This type of trust is a private agreement and is a means by which challenges to a Will can be avoided without will contests and litigation. Irrevocable Trust planning, in addition to the purpose of avoiding probate, like the revocable trust, will have the added benefit of protecting the value of all of the assets (financial and real property) form the costs of future long term care. This point is important enough to state it again. Irrevocable trust planning, avoids probate (like the Revocable trust), AND if done in advance of needing care, protects the value of the asset of the property (real property or financial) from having to be lost to the cost of care.

An irrevocable trust must include the necessary language to provide protection from medical costs and creditors. Some key language will be drafted to meet your particular estate planning goals. Once the ownership or title on assets has been transferred to the trust, it will take five years, or sixty months before the assets and property are fully protected from the expenses of nursing home care.

Frequently Asked Questions:

Why not just transfer the deed or my assets to my children to "get them out of my name"?

Any assets transferred to another person, or held jointly with another person, could be at risk if the joint owner has financial problems. If one transfer the deed to property outright there are capital gains tax implications. If, for example, a person transferred title to a son, if the

son predeceases, there could be unintended consequences, such as the son's spouse owning the house. If one's child is joint owner on bank accounts, if he/she is involved in a lawsuit, bankruptcy or divorce, those assets could be jeopardized. Assets and property transferred to a trust are recorded using the Tax Identification Number, rather than any person's social security number to avoid such consequences.

What if I need nursing home care before 5 years has passed since I funded the trust?

In NY state the law provides steps that can be taken to revoke an irrevocable trust. Once an attorney has completed the documents necessary and the trust is properly revoked, if the individual is in a nursing home, depending on the circumstances some or all of the assets can be protected from being spent on nursing home bills.

If I put my savings in the trust, will have to ask my trustees every time I need money?

Absolutely, positively, "NO!" When it comes to transferring assets to the trust, the attorney will advise, based on your particular circumstances, and what feels comfortable to you. The income, or interest earned by the assets held in the trust will continue to be part of your income. You, with the advice of the attorney will decide how much you feel comfortable putting into the trust, and how much you would like to keep outside of the trust for easier access should you need liquidity for emergency or personal spending.

Can liquid assets, like my savings be transferred into the trust as well as real property?

Yes, the financial assets will need to be titled to the trust, using the tax identification number and will be protected in the same manner as real property, from the date of transfer of the asset.

In conclusion, if you live in New York, and have assets and property that you would like to preserve for your family to inherit, rather than losing these assets to the costs associated with medical care, you MUST do advance planning. You owe it to yourselves and your family to make informed decisions in these matters, by consulting with attorneys experienced in these matters. Real Estate Update Mortgage Rates

As of this writing (Monday, June 10), 30-year fixed rate mortgages are at 3.80 percent, approximately. This costs \$466/100k/month.

Mortgage rates have trended down during the past three months from about 4.30 percent in April. As of now, it appears that this trend will continue. In fact, the Fed Funds futures market implies a 75 percent possibility of a cut in short term interest rates by July 31.

The Federal Reserve has released statements lately which express a willingness to reduce short term rates depending on economic conditions. A rate cut could even occur before July 31, but this is not a certainty. A rate cut might not even happen at all!. It depends on the economy.

Of course, a cut in short term rates does not necessarily imply that 30year fixed rates will simultaneously decline; other factors come into play. However, there's a decent chance that this could happen.



What's In It For Us?

Rampant leakage, exploding radiators and malfunctioning elevators were just the tip of the spear among a barrage of complaints issued by tenants of the Bay Towers residential complex, as many questioned the logic behind a suggested rent hike advanced by the ownership group.

The June 10 public hearing, held inside the Beach Channel Educational Campus auditorium, got off on the wrong foot, with Democratic District Leader Lew Simon—a one-time Bay Towers resident in his formative years—arguing against the legitimacy of the meeting organized by the NYC Department of Housing Preservation and Development

In an application letter sent to the hundreds of individuals occupying the federally-subsidized Beach 98th Street development, HPD Assistant Commissioner Julie Walpert apprised tenants of the hearing and invited them to weigh in on the proposal.

The problem, however, was that many of the attendees claimed that they never received the notification and came to the information session unprepared on the terms of the proprietor's bid to boost monthly rental fees

HPD Operations Director Gary Sloman did his best to carry through with the official meeting by continually trying to silence Simon, who pointed out that the city agency never pro-

dialogue. The Rockaway Park-based activist not only demanded that HPD postpone the meeting, he requested that a subsequent gathering be scheduled for 6 p.m.—instead of 5 p.m. — to afford several working residents ample time to make atten-

An escalating drumbeat to reschedule the proceeding left a reluctant Sloman little choice but to follow suit by giving the audience a deferment, while also promising to take an earlier start time "under consideration."

HPD's exit left project managers Alexander Yulfo and Jay Cengiz of Camber Property Group—an hired organization entrusted with the task of facilitating the increaseaddress the crowd on their own. They assured everyone that they would stick around till midnight if necessary to address their concerns and how each may be uniquely affected by the rent hike, given their Section 8 and/or RAP (rental assistance programs) status or lack thereof.

"These people are my family. I represent them as an elected. I have major problems with these buildings,' began Simon. "Over 30 years, these buildings have been a cash cow. Work does not get done in these buildings. Every day the elevators are broken, no hot water, no heat, the windows don't work, people fall in the hallway."

In addition to the lack of services received by the residents, continued

Simon, about "60-percent" of them are paying market-rate rents and aren't financially equipped to absorb any kind of sudden increase.

While HUD-assisted (U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development) tenants occupying one, two and three-family units at Bay Towers are only required to pay 30percent of their gross income for rent, market-rate occupants aren't accommodated with any sort of government support.

The average going rate for rent increases in rent-stabilized homes, as per Simon, is 1-percent per year, a number, he said, that can't be exceeded according to NYC rent guidelines.

The Camber Property Group spokespeople, conversely, told the 50 or so residents at the school facility that no one in either of the two Bay Towers edifices would see their rents inflate by more than 7 percent.

"This is a recapitalization. The reason that it's necessary is because there's not a lot of cash flow and there probably never has been," retorted Yulfo. "Part of what we're doing here is raising the rents. Most of the burden, by the way, is being paid by Section 8 HUD. So, bringing in that new contract, it allows this project to be refinanced using conventional financing, going out to banks and getting loans out to HDC (NYC Housing Development Corporation). It allowed us to get new debt.'

He added: "It won't be your respon-

sibility. By doing that we're able to finance renovations that this project could never afford before. As part of that refinance, we would be able to do more than \$15 million of work. That work, HDC, the city, won't let us close until we show them the scope of work. They're going to have engineers every month who are going to be coming by. You guys will all be involved in the

Yulfo's rundown and justification of the process didn't hold water with one resident who asked for more "transparency," noting how Bay Towers Company and Bay Towers Exchange Limited Partnership were the recipients of government monies even prior to Superstorm Sandy, but never put those funds to proper use.

"We never know what you're doing. Every time I look around, you're always fixing something, but it never gets completed. You got a place of dilapidation and you have the audacity to ask for money? Management come to the light."

Fellow resident and former Ocean Bay property manager Laytasha Gregory assumed a more measured approach by imploring her neighbors to hold maintenance staff accountable for every renovation that each tenant is due.

"I think the reality is if this gets approved, when this gets approved, it's going to be the responsibility of us as residents to [monitor] managecontinued on page 74

Lesbian, Gay, Bixsexual, Transgender and Queer (LGBTQ) Pride Month is finally here and it's shaping up to be a colorful, fun-filled June.

The festivities—promoting individuality, inclusivity, diversity, and most importantly, LGBTQ people's historical contributions at a local and national level-kick off every summer around the country to commemorate the 1969 Stonewall Uprising in Manhattan, a critical moment in the Gay Liberation Movement in this country.

Thankfully, these days you don't have to "travel to Manhattan to be out," says Executive Director of Out Rockaway, Jim Burke, who moved to the peninsula 16 years ago (his parents met on the boardwalk here when they were teenagers). Established in 2015, this organization's main mission is visibility for the LGBTQ community living here.

"It's important that people can be themselves where they live," Burke explained. "They should be able to socialize, shop, conduct business, and get medical treatment and services here on the peninsula with sensitivity and understanding. We want to make sure no one feels isolated or alone."

"We are part of this community and love living here and work to make sure Rockaway is inclusive," Burke continued, before emphasizing the importance of supporting LGBTQ youth here. "It does get better and you are not alone. We did a forum last year at the Ocean Bay Houses and there was a lot of youth participation and interest. We will be doing more of this type of outreach in the fall and winter months.3

Rockaway and LGBTQ rights are close to Burke's heart as evidenced by the success of Out Rockaway: the organization were represented in the Queens Pride Parade in Jackson Heights and will also march in the Long Island Pride Parade in Long Beach on June 23. Burke told The Wave that the Rockaway contingent always receives a "boisterous always receives a response."

Out Rockaway has generated support from the likes of Assemblywoman Stacey Pheffer Amato, Councilman Donovan Richards, and Eric Ulrich. But Burke noted that although they "have come along way," stigma remains in certain areas.

"We are really trying to break that [stigma] down," Burke said. 'Rockaway was changed for the better-we have lot more mutual respect and understanding here now but there are still pockets of discrimination. However, our events attract a lot of straight people too and we welcome them. We are all about inclusivity."

Another Out Rockaway member Victoria Barber, who has encountered such stigma directly, said that it "really falls along generational lines and political persuasions."

"It is great to have the group Out Rockaway and be a visible presence in the community. It serves to extend a hand to all and be welcoming," Barber said. "Jane and I lived in Key West for 25 years and its motto was One Human Family. I'd like to think Rockaway was one too. There is so much to celebrate here.

The LGBTQ community still face intolerance on a national scale, however; Burke agreed that things like the 'Straight Parade Parade'-provisionally scheduled for late August in Boston—demonstrated such "cluenesses."



The Rockaway club also does a run for education.



theater Tony-type awards. But there were other factors that made Doubt at the RTC something more than the sum of its parts. The intimacy of the theater itself. The wonderful Frank Caiati designed (that boy is a quadruple threat) and the Tony Homsey-led construction crew that built the sets. The costumes by Adele Wendt. And stage manager Suzanne Riggs who kept her finger on the button.

A few of Frank Caiati's thoughts on FB are worth sharing: "I want to express my gratitude to everyone involved with this production. David and Jodee were rockstar Directors, always willing to entertain discussion and meticulous in what they wanted to see. Suzanne, our fearless stage manager, as per usual, supported us....and spoiled us every day. The crew was literal ninjas moving the enormous set pieces (and no one got run-over!) and being hilarious and kind humans. And finally...my three ladies, Susan, Ashley and Billyn were so much FUN backstage and so giving and present onstage.'

Most people see the theater as being about the people on the stage. Productions at the RTC are much more than the sum of their parts and in over a dozen years of involvement, I've learned about every aspect of the theater, which has made all theater experiences so enjoyable. Frank notes the backstage crew who had to move a

heavy mobile stage (the office) numerous times. For a four-character play, there were a hell of a lot more behind the scenes people.

Questions like will this part of the set obstruct the sight lines of some of the audience? Some of us where there until 4 PM.

The Newsies crew has not had access to the stage until now. A month is not that long turnaround time, especially with a musical with a lot of choreography.

And did I mention the power blackout at Fort Tilden which forced the rental of a generator that looks like a house I could move into? The show must go on (and Producer Susan Jasper always does what has to be done). Why do they do it?

If you believe the internet experts, Rockaway will be underwater late in this century if the Greenland Ice Sheet continues to melt as fast as it

is at present. Those experts say that sea levels off the coast of the entire northeast region could rise by 12 to 20 inches more than any other region on the east coast due to a strange but erratic water current. That could put residents from Nova Scotia to New York at particular risk, experts say.

The number of firearms recovered at crime scenes in New York City dropped to 5,129 in 2008 against 5,913 the previous year, according to information released to the press by the federal Department of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives. The great majority of the firearms confiscated in the city came from other states, notably Virginia, Florida and Pennsylvania, where buying multiple guns is relatively simple for residents. The guns are then transported to Rockaway, where they are sold out of the trunk of the car in Redfern or Hammels, or on some Far Rockaway street corner. More than 1,000 of the guns were confiscated from people younger than 21years-of-age, and at least of few of them were recovered in Rockaway.

20 years ago...

The Beth-El Temple, Church of ${\rm God\ in\ Christ\ in\ Far\ Rockaway\ has}$ received a \$1,500 grant from the Landmarks Conservancy, one of 12 churches and synagogues on the city that received the annual grants. The money is to be used to maintain, repair and restore religious buildings.





Power To Move You

LiLi Roquelin aims to inspire at Rockstock & Barrels

If visiting beachgoers suddenly find themselves swept away by an angelic sound emanating from the boardwalk soundstage at Saturday's Rockstock & Barrels, chances are it will probably be coming from French phenom LiLi Roquelin, who will be part of the pageantry at the annual surf, skate and music festival.

The heralded singer/songwriter/ producer is no stranger to big crowds— see her American National Anthem performance at Citi Field or Rockaway, for that matter, as she's recently headlined Thai Rock. But the June 15 showcase will be the Astoria resident's first beach event that will see the multi-award winning artist join the likes of jazz songstress Sasha Dobson and violinist Morgan Weidinger, among others, at the peninsula's preeminent summer boardwalk bash.



The seductive vocalist will be performing tracks her latest release "Be Inspired."

"I will be performing songs from my new album "Be Inspired." It's a mix of upbeat indie/folky pop-rock songs and a few ballads on voice/piano and ukulele, accompanied by guitar and drum offerings, provided by Curtis Becraft and Sam Scozzari," said Roquelin, who prior to relocating to New York nearly 12 years ago, lived Fame, Cleveland, Ohio.

It was in the Midwestern market that the fledgling performer learned much of what she knows about the business through her singing, recording and lyrical production work with two rock bands over a period of four

"I really enjoying telling a story and how my songs move people,' observed the local musician who has relentlessly pursued — and achieved—her goals of being a proficient pianist and, more recently, mastering the art of playing the ukulele.

Roquelin's storytelling powers shine through in her previous offerings as well, including featured tracks of her "Beautiful Sun" album in which she directed bassist/guitarist Askold Buk and cellist Christopher Marion through her mesmerizing audio journey.

One of her peers that Roquelin credits in her professional development is Brian Scheuble, the mix engineer of her latest LP.

"He is not only talented and has the biggest names in the industry on his résumé (see Elton John, Sheryl Crow, Liz Phair, et al.); he is humble; he has a high work ethic and is egoless. He is not condescending, which is hard to find, especially when you're a woman producer in a maledominated industry."

In fact, Roquelin noted that only 7percent of music producers are, in fact, female, and hopes to encourage other women to not harbor any fears that may dissuade them from directing or even having complete control of their musical endeavors.

Since migrating from her native Toulon, France, the rising star has earned considerable notoriety through social media, as evidenced by her 9,500 real followers on Twitter and 10,000 real followers Instagram.

But while those numbers are certainly nothing to sneeze at, the rising star has little time to look back and

"I am not afraid of challenges. I like to push myself out of my comfort zone, because that is the only way to grow. In my head, I'm constantly creating or coming up with marketing ideas to get my music out there,' added the stunning vocalist, who counts meditation, psychology, nature walks and reading French literature among her favorite hobbies.

Rockstock & Barrels is an opportunity for Roquelin to reconnect with one of the music exhibition's founding fathers, Walker Hornung, who much like Roquelin has ample experience in multiple aspects of creating and performing music.

A sense of joy, happiness and allout undiluted tomfoolery is part of the experience when folks take in their first sampling of the *Dinosaur Village* EP this weekend by a fearsome foursome of young Rockaway musicians who embody the concept of "living in the now."

"Surf rock is kind of the element we're just in at the moment," surmised lead vocalist Graham Hill while offering The Wave his most accurate description of the band's current direction.

"This EP is about having fun," chimed in drum master Jake Menged. "In the future, we'll do singsongy stuff because Graham Hill is an amazing songwriter. He writes deep-ass [stuff]. But this EP doesn't reflect that."

When asked what beachgoers can be in store for when they peek into one of the weekend shows, Hill warned the unindoctrinated that they shouldn't be expecting the type of laid-back atmosphere you may walk into at the Blue Note with Kenny G. on the bill.

"We definitely play loud and we play fast. There's really not much of a break in our set. We have a few songs that are calm, but most

of the time we're loud and fast," said the fiercely proud Rockaway native, whose videos often glorify Beach Channel Drive, the Beach 90th Street Skatepark and other peninsula localos

"If you're trying to find some quiet time, you shouldn't be coming to a Skells show."

One of the qualities that makes this combo of twentysomethings refreshingly unique is their undeniable chemistry born out of the fact that Hill, Menged, bassist Eric Dejmek and guitarist James Reen are best friends who never broke out of their high school routine of hanging together on a daily basis.

And though all have regular day jobs to make ends meet, they always make time to sit back, pick up a few instruments and see what comes of it.

"We don't have any reason or rhyme to why things happen. There's some songs that one of us will write entirely, like the single we just put out "The Surf King." It was recorded and produced, mastered and written by Jake. None of us had anything to do with it. But then there's other songs that James Reen or Eric or I myself will write. We just watch it all unfold. We kind of have this tendency to say 'yes' to any idea that comes to the puddle," recounted Hill.

When pressed on where they envision themselves a few years down the road, they all agreed that seeing one of their tracks licensed for a Quentin Tarantino flick would be their ultimate pie-in-the-sky dream.

Their other goal, quipped Menged, is to never smoke cigarettes again.

But of more immediate concern is a forthcoming full-length album the four-year-old combo will start pouring their energies in toward the end the beach season, as they plan to collaborate with many of their friends/ peers in the local music scene, including "Patsy" Carroll and company from Beach Channel Records.

Other shout outs went out to Irish Joe, Super Burrito, Rockaway Beach Bakery, Edible Island, Jimmy Dowd and Joe Falcone, as the Skells ac-

Tacos Y Mas

If you are seeking an affordable, casual and authentic Mexican meal here in Rockaway, Tacos Y Mas could be just the ticket, as it is brimming with taquería soul.

At Tacos Y Mas, located 1831 Mott Avenue in Far Rockaway, is all about tacos served DIY style, with over 10 possible taco combinations. There is a mix of traditional flavors—not only taco specific—but in regards to arepas, papusa, tortas and chimichangas. Do not worry I will ease you through it.

Arepas—I have seen them on a menu countless times, but what is it exactly? Simply put they are cornmeal pockets; sort of like if an English muffin and tortillas had a baby. The dough is traditionally made, maize, salt, and water. These little pockets take on the same functionality as pita, and are very versatile as they can be baked, grilled, or fried and stuffed with essentially any and everything.

Papusa—these have a likeness to flatbread, like a cornmeal flatbread, with a very similar in design to arepas except they are a bit larger and flatter. They also hail from a different part of Central America.

Tortas—more of a broad term, essentially a sandwich. And of course, we are all familiar with chimichangas-fried carbs with extra cheesy goodness tucked inside. The menu is surprisingly robust. This unsuspecting little restaurant is intimate and warm and has all you crave that is delicious, spicy and familiar. I decided to go with a classic; three basic carne asada tacos, which are served on a warm corn tortilla with cilantro, onion, radish, and guacamole, topped with lime. Freshness is key in a simple yet flavorful dish, and it just blossoms in your mouth. The cilantro comes through and the bite from the onion sets the tone for a "fresca" meal. The steak has bold spices, and if you like a little crema, you can order the taco supreme which comes with tomato, sour cream, and mozzarella cheese.


Next on the list, I went in another direction with their take on a Mexican salad bowl. This was epic. It came in a large fried taco shell that looks like a floral canopy, filled to the brim with black (or

pinto beans), lettuce, tomatoes, cilantro, red onions, guacamole, sour cream, cheese and pico de gallo, served with any protein choice you desire. The salad was so refreshing and there is something quite satisfactory about devouring the very bowl you are eating from.

For a plant-based beverage, why not go for some horchata? It is a native staple and so delicious. Horchata is a grain-based beverage often made from rice and sometimes with nuts or seeds and spiced with cinnamon, nutmeg and then sweetened. Traditional Mexican horchata actually has no dairy in it,

so think of it like original nut milk. Though, there are current versions that include dairy in the recipe. The horchata can be served chilled or warm and tastes like Christmas in a cup with a twist.

So, if you love authentic Mexican fare, this Mott Avenue treasure is for you.

Do You Know The Keto Way In Rockaway?

Endless rivers of butter, plates piled high with bacon and cheese; these are all the things to look forward to when going into ketosis, a high in fat, low in carb diet that has taken Rockaway by storm.

Keto's acceptability seems to be tethered to the vast amount of weight loss when on Keto, and interest might not wither anytime soon. But, what is Keto? Is it healthy?

For those who are unaware, the ketogenic diet is based on a daily intake very low in carbs and very high in fat, along with copious amounts of protein. These eating habits are formed to push your body into a state of metabolic bliss, where the body then uses stored fat as fuel. This is called being in ketosis.

When your body is in ketosis, the body creates organic compounds called ketones. So, the expected results is that the body then loses weight much like using the leftovers in the kitchen fridge for the next meal, while looking at a empty fridge the next day.

Typically in any household, there are ebbs and flows of what's for dinner and while take-out and dining out are very viable options, but on Keto where do you go? I recently went out to discover some "Keto friendly" places.

Fit Food Kitchen (FFK) is a local

Fit Food Kitchen (FFK) is a local eatery that has two storefronts, one located in Riis Park Bazaar (167-02 Rockaway Beach Blvd, at the Bathhouse on the West Wing) which is open on Saturdays and Sundays), and the other on 114-04 Beach Channel Drive.

FFK offers locals healthy options that not only includes Keto, but Paleo and Vegan as well. FFK's main appeal is the take-home pre-planned meal system that is very convenient. By going to their website: https://www.fitfoodkitchen.org you can actually pick and choose what kind of meals you would like to be delivered to your

home either on a daily or weekly basis, and there are even daily juice options all in an affordable price range.

I stopped by their Riis Park Bazaar storefront and tried out a keto-friendly meal. You can order at this location, but only what is stocked for the day. I requested the buffalo chicken salad and detox water. Let me just say, initially I was not too enthused because when I hear the word salad, I just do not get excited. However, the weight of this hefty salad will sway you otherwise. The portion was large, and I was in awe at the amount of chicken provided. The detox drink of choice was a citrus blend. The buffalo sauce hit all the notes of a traditional buffalo sauce and was more on the tangy side, which I prefer. The greens were crunchy and fresh. FFK has other options as well like, chicken tortilla soup, unsweetened chia seed pudding for breakfast, zucchini lasagna for dinner.

Next stop on my list, local favorite Cuisine by Claudette (located at 143 Beach 116 Street, with locations at 190 Beach 69th or Riis Park Bazaar, Bay 9), which has quite a few Keto options as well in addition to prepared meals you can have delivered to you at your home!

There are some meal ideas you can order like the fan favorite called "The Jessicauli" bowl (which is what I ordered). You guessed it, it is a cauliflower bowl loaded with cauliflower rice, lemon chicken, chickpeas, arugula and feta with a vinaigrette. The bowl was so fun and vibrant and had a lot of wholesome ingredients I do love. Just a reminder that chickpeas, as lovely as they are, a little on the high side when considering carbs for keto, so be cautious. The arugula was delicious with a little spicy kick, and come on, feta makes everything bett-a. Other options available are grilled chicken with cauliflower rice and roasted salmon served with broccoli rabe and cauliflower rice.

Both options are really convenient and helpful on the road to ketosis. If you are keto-curious, like me you can try incorporating some of the Keto elements in your daily regime. Not everyone should, or can commit to Keto but everyone can explore different ways of eating and look at clean food for a more balanced lifestyle.






"Stories In Print" Opens

media typewritten art that reflects the conceptualism of writings that expose memories, experiences and stories of diversity.

"I call it "The Soul Has No Gender edition 2," and this particular print shows different genders and sexes typed out for Pride Month," explains Siridejchai. "I cut out different rainbow colors and sized and shaped them differently to reflect how no one person is the same ... but it also means

diversity and racism too."

Another medium Siridejchai focuses in is intaglio printmaking, creating a bridge between images and words by using the Chine-Colle technique, using only a typewriter and thin Japanese paper to create various symbolic shapes, signs, etc. to tell the core of his stories to his audience.

Artist Anita Giraldo got to share some of her prints at RAA for the first time, displaying dauntless politically-

"There are quotes from Frederick Douglass, Gloria Steinem and Angela Davis and they're all in the discourse of American quotes expressed in the typeface clarendon, recognized as the wild west typeface. 



DOI Report Confirms Improprieties At DBP

city's Department of Investigations (DOI) has officially communicated a number of findings that disprove a slew of inquisitions rendered by the overseeing housing group.

To that point, the document, for example, states how HPD "found no truth to the allegation that the Directors of the corporation are receiving free kitchen appliances from the co-op," when indeed a further examination revealed that DBP Board members not only accepted those items, but never fully reimbursed the development for them.

The letter, in fact, states that HPD issued a directive authorizing DBP to accommodate any share-holder requesting appliances in an effort to "remediate the conflict" by the Board's self-dealing actions.

By mandating what is essentially an interest-free loan for shareholders to purchase the household domestic products without requiring a repayment of the funds, as per the document, HPD's decision to green-light the monetary advances could end up costing the co-operative millions of dollars.

Among the specific recommendations communicated to HPD were that the governmental supervising body ensure that all Board members fully pay DBP for any appliances provided by the co-op. In addition, HPD has been instructed to advise the Board to terminate the interest-free loan appliance program.

The investigation also unearthed deficiencies in complaint tracking in that HPD has failed to implement a real system to account for the many grievances that are submitted about the current Board leadership.

In a June 26, 2018 interview with DOI, HPD Assistant Commissioner Julie Walpert couldn't reportedly explain the system in place that monitors and addresses resident gripes.

Furthermore, the missive acknowledges DBP's decision to end its relationship with First Residential Service (FSR) as its management company due to a conflict of interest between FSR Director Denise Clarke and outside contractor Philbert Giddings. The latter not only had a romantic relationship with the since-fired Clarke, but was also making payments to her during their association.

While Stacey Pheffer Amato who also resides in one of the five DBP buildings— hasn't yet furnished The Wave with a statement on the latest investigation results, other shareholders were satisfied with the DOI initiative.

"It supports much of what was stated in the Article 78 file in court," observed Dolores Orr, who occupies the 8400 Shore Front Parkway edifice. "So, it just reaffirms all the issues that residents have identified since 2011. In terms of what the next step is, I hope that HPD would move forward gain the supervision that they one time did have."

But what will ultimately solve many of the issues at hand for many shareholders who feel underrepresented is a new election that would usher in a whole new Board.

In past 2011 election, according to the DOI, an audio clip indicated that Clarke's son, Warren, a DBP maintenance worker, was called to the current Board president's apartment to collect proxies that she herself filled out. An unidentified voice states that the proxies were mailed to deceased shareholders and other individuals who no longer reside at DBP.

When longtime DBP co-op owner Joanne Smith learned of the clip and other details, she simply added: "The shareholders will have their day in court and that will force the board and HPD to be held accountable for their actions, or lack thereof, to a judge and a court of law."

Patti McCabe of 8100 Shore Front Parkway had a lot of the same misgivings about both parties under scrutiny in the official report signed by Inspector General Jessica Heegan.

"I think that all HPD staff that turned a deaf ear to our concerns should be transferred out of the Mitchell Lama Division. I wish that the Board members that have acted in a manner not beneficial into all the shareholders could be evicted. And, of course, a new election should be held immediately! In years past, the shareholders had a say in changes and it was not a dictatorship."

But then the question remains: do DOI's "recommendations" really hold water and will they spark their fellow city agency to actively make amends for years of alleged negligence and mismanagement?

"The language was strong by DOI, so I don't know if DOI has the authority to mandate that to HPD or strongly recommend— I don't know," concluded Orr.

An attempt on the part of two guest speakers to sell Community Board 14's Health and Social Services Committee on their proposal for a new outpatient substance abuse center didn't win anybody over during an information session that became increasingly heated.

Nassau County-based business owner Sol Weiss and colleague Tyler Kargman's presentation at the June 6 meeting at the Bayswater Jewish Center didn't resonate with Committee members despite the pair citing a need for the site at 230 Beach 102nd St. based on 269 Queens residents dying from drug overdoses in 2017.

Community Board 14 Chairperson Dolores Orr went into cross examination mode by pointedly asking the Clear Path Counseling Center reps how many deaths occurred within the confines of the Rockaway peninsula from Breezy to Bayswater and its immediate surrounding areas.

"You're basing a decision to bring services to a community when you don't know what the statistics are for that community," said Orr, who lambasted Weiss and Kargman when they admitted having no knowledge of how many locals were affected by their reported statistic.

"We're talking about our community; we're not talking about Queens. I'm just repeating back to you that you said that there's a need for a local facility for those who have been incarcerated for drug use. So, you're leading us to believe that we have residents that have been incarcerated and mandated care. How many of those people fall within the 5-mile radius of where this building is going?

Kargman muttered that he would look into it.

Orr and other community members, including Far Rockaway civic leader Eugene Falik, further objected to the notion of adding a drug counseling venue in Rockaway Park by questioning whether Weiss—the owner of a medical billing software company (Millin Associates) and son of parents who run multiple home healthcare operations—had the know-how required to manage the clinic he described.

The blueprint, as outlined by the investor and his confidant, entails employing four people—a medical director, a clinical director, a case worker and receptionist-who would be servicing a maximum of 20 patients per day at full utilization.

Substance abusers benefitting from the counseling, it was confirmed, could include those who were previously incarcerated and are mandated by law to utilize the Clear Path loca-

Committee members were also informed of a recommendation from former NYS OASAS (Office of Alcoholism & Substance Abuse Services) Commissioner and current consultant Shari Noonan, who reportedly told Weiss that the 102nd Street building was in a "good" and "untapped" area.

When consulting with State Senator Joseph Addabbo for insight in gaining approval for a permit to run an Article 32 clinic, the applicant was told by the state legislator to reach out to the community in an effort to take the temperature of peninsula stakeholders regarding their bid to as they do on selecting "the best person in the city or in the country" for what they need.'

The local activist also filled in attendees on how his own background as a billing systems professional and how that doesn't make him—nor Weiss—qualified to spearhead a chemical dependency clinic.

Committee Co-Chair Felicia Johnson repeatedly asked if Community Board 14's failure to endorse Weiss' business plan would be enough to impede and/or dissuade state government from green lighting it. The medical billing specialist suggested that NYS powers that be would indeed have the authority to override any official vote taken by the local advisory body.

"Our hope is if we could get the community excited about it," insisted Weiss, who currently resides in nearmale homeless shelter moving into a Beach 101st Street warehouse and asked him to "do his homework" before showing up to a CB14 meet-

Other attendees who called the aspiring counseling center proprietor to the carpet were CB14 member Eddy Pastore, who expressed his concerns with any business that welcomes in dysfunctional people who are mandated to travel to a site against their will.

Democratic District Leader Lew Simon was especially animated when addressing the men under the spot-

"Excuse me, you see a cash cow. You see a way to make a buck in our community. You have no experience in this field," began the impassioned elected official, who accused Weiss of trying to use lists of patients he has from his family home healthcare business and/or personal software company to attract clients for his proposed counseling center. That allegation—if true according to Simon—is in violation of the HIPPA (Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996) Privacy Rule.

"You live in Lawrence. You tell me how you found Rockaway? I think you are looking for dollars and cents and I think you're connected with the shelter. I think the man who's buying the building is connected with the shelter, so shame on you. You're a

Committee member Mordechai Dicker reprimanded Simon for calling Weiss the Yiddish equivalent of a snake-oil salesman and all out "shyster." He asked the district leader to produce proof of his charges.

The meeting unraveled from there, as people began talking over one another and soon after came to a close, with the community remaining steadfastly united in their condemnation of a chemical dependency clinic entering their charming coastal destination.

set up shop in the commercial space they leased three months ago.

Weiss assured the Committee that his plan is to open up the type of counseling service that wouldn't engage in the dispensation of any methadone or suboxone to patients grappling with an opioid addiction.

"The reality is every community, including my own, including the Five Towns, including Far Rockaway, [every] religion, color or ethnicity, again, is plagued by the opioid addiction," maintained Weiss in his futile attempt to justify his business endeavor to a reluctant and skeptical

"So, the idea is to open a substance abuse counseling center like a simple type of [psychological] type of office and we're very, very sensitive to the fact that we weren't just going to be doing this in the middle of your main streets and just pop up in a store-

Falik—who serves as an executive member of the Bayswater Civic Association—wasn't buying into the rhetoric and disputed Weiss' claims about the lack of similar outpatient offices in the immediate vicinity of Rockaway Beach/Rockaway Park. He noted that neither he nor several others place as high a premium on distance

by Lawrence. "It would be added value to the community." Johnson shot back: "Let me just quell that belief. What you are feeling and what you are hearing is a community that has taken their fair share and above of nursing homes, shelters and for you to live two blocks off of Mott Avenue and not know all of this, I don't know what part of Mott Avenue you live

"LGBTQ Parades started as an uprising against blatant discrimination, a call for equal rights and to promote visibility. They are still a great tool to show people that they are not alone and don't have to feel isolated," Burke explained. "Our youth suicide rate is high and substance abuse is an outlet people use to deal with isolation and discrimination so anything that makes light of these very serious issues is just a demonstration of ignorance and privilege."

Nevertheless, the LGBTQ community here continue to combat stigma via a whole host of fun, educational events throughout June. Out Rockaway member Olivia Harriss added that this time frame "gives people a chance to participate in something that works for their schedule."

School Scope

Experience Counts

I've been watching D-Day movies and finally saw Saving Private Ryan. In pretty much all war movies we see the big differences between grizzled war veterans and the rookies who are often scared to death. It is so clear how important experience is in warfare. I mean what com-

mander wouldn't want troops

who knew the ropes?

In education, we often find just the opposite where newbies are preferred. Low salaries. Non-tenured. They won't talk back and will often do anything asked by administrators, no matter how stupid. And wise in education combat zones like those grizzled sergeants. Too many principals love newbies who they can manipulate.

Over the past few decades, the idea that experience makes a difference for a teacher has been disparaged by the ed deformers. Note the growth of Teach for America and the Teaching Fellows where you get 6 weeks of boot camp and are sent into the world to make guinea pigs of students while you learn the ropes.

I was one of those. In 1967 grad students were losing their deferments and going into a six-week boot camp for new teachers and teaching for two years was a way out and I took it and became a newbie teacher. You know those war movies where the guy is sweating and wracked with fear-Corporal Upham in Private Ryan is the prototype—a coward afraid of combat. I was Upham my first year of teaching. Facing a class of children and keeping them under control was my greatest fear. They were often off the wall. I was envious of these little ladies in my school who had perfect control. When I finally learned how to control a class it was one of the major achievements of my life. I never would have survived as a teacher if I couldn't. Well. I could have become an administrator.

My friend Arthur Goldstein, who is an ESL teacher and the union leader at Francis Lewis HS, one of the largest and most overcrowded in the city, for the past 15 years has written a very influential education oriented blog called NYC Educator sharing a lot of insights into the many facets of the process and often mystery of teaching.

I wanted to share an excerpt from his posting on June 12 about



the coming end of the school year. Arthur has given his finals but still has to keep the students interested. He gives them a surprise test with questions such as: When was the War of 1812? Where does Chinese food come from? What color is the whiteboard? He wondered about a student who got one

of these wrong.

Arthur has many decades of teaching and here he gets to some of the essences of why experience matters for teachers

"One of the things Cuomo didn't consider when pushing the miserable evaluation law is what it's like to bomb in front of 34 teenagers. This, of course, is because he's never taught, and he's never been through what we go through each and every day. I don't know about you, but I fear that more than I fear some supervisor with an iPad. I remember it happening to me in my first few years. I remember watching other teachers and wondering exactly what they were doing that I was not. Why are their classes calm while mine is off the wall? I'm not sure there's an easy response to that. I'd say things got just a little better when I started calling houses. And maybe I've grown more confident or authoritative over the years. Mostly, I have more experience and more go-to lesson plans. If I see something not working I can usually push it in another direction and try something at least different, if not always better."

That's it. Arthur has the experience to see what is not working and has the confidence he can figure things out. Like the great pitcher whose slider is not working but adjusts. Not to compare teaching to baseball. Or combat. Well, maybe. One of my old pals and colleagues, Rockaway resident David Bentley used to tell the story of his first year in a tough school in 1967-68 when a class of children was so out of control he walked into the office of the principal, a tough old bird named Sophie Beller (Lugosi was her nickname) and told her he was quitting and would rather go to Vietnam. She sent him home for the day to recover and he ended up becoming one of the great teachers in my school. Ahhhh, that good ol' experience does





Boston's darkest hour: 'City on a Hill' tells a story of crime and redemption

Hollywood mogul Ben Affleck is no stranger to the subgenre of Boston crime dramas. The Academy Award winner grew up just outside of Boston, and his rise to directorial acclaim is marked by films about his hometown's criminal underworld. "Gone Baby Gone" (2007), a drama about a local private eye's hunt for a child abductor, displays the working-class realities of a Boston neighborhood ridden with drugs and violence; 2010's "The Town" follows the real-life events of a large-scale bank robbery in Fenway

Now, Affleck has teamed up with childhood friend and co-Oscar winner Matt Damon ("The Departed," 2006) to co-executive produce his latest brainchild, "City on a Hill." The series, with a debut season consisting of 10 episodes, is a fictionalized account of "Operation Ceasefire," a project now more commonly known as the Boston Miracle. Starring Kevin Bacon ("Footloose," 1984) and Aldis Hodge ("Straight Outta Compton," 2015) in lead roles, "City on a Hill" premieres Sunday, June 16, on Showtime.

The Boston Miracle occurred in the '90s, when the city's police department implemented a program, designed by criminology professor David M. Kennedy, to combat the rampant youth gun violence of the time. The program, dubbed Operation Ceasefire, was groundbreaking in that it employed research tactics to help law enforcement understand and effectively target the main sources of gun trafficking and gang crimes.

The project was such a sweeping success that Boston's youth homicide rate fell by 63 percent, and it was the inspiration behind Group Violence Intervention projects that are still being employed throughout New York and other states today. Contemplating how the historic event of the Boston Miracle shook the city's entire law enforcement to its core, "City on a Hill" writer Chuck MacLean said, "Everything had been one way for such a long time, it seemed impossible to change, and it did, very quickly."

The show depicts Boston as it was in the 1990s, a world in which rampant crime and gang violence is propped up by a cesspool of corrupt law enforcement officials who are invested in the status quo of a crime driven economy, and a culture of Aldis Hodge unchecked racism. Bacon and Kevin stars as corrupt-but-Bacon star in



Decourcy Ward, a newly appointed assistant district attorney from Brooklyn. According to Showtime, the tension-fraught

pairing "take on a family of armored car robbers in a case that grows to involve, and ultimately subvert, the entire criminal justice system of Boston." The series also stars Jonathan Tucker ("Kingdom"), Mark O'Brien ("Republic of Doyle"), Amanda Clayton ("If Loving You Is Wrong") and Jill Hennessy ("Crossing Jordan"). Bacon's Rohr is smug and dismissive, a man

well practiced at tampering with local justice to his own ends. As comfortable with partaking in the city's illicit underworld

as he is with policing it, he oversees corruption in dealings with Boston street gangs.

Cultural Shift At SJEH Sweeping changes reported at CB14 Health and Social Services Committee meeting

The days of discourteous service at St. John's Episcopal Hospital (SJEH) is nothing more than a distant memory, according to one spokesperson, who filled in listeners at the Bayswater Jewish Center on how the Far Rockaway medical facility has adopted a new attitude.

A scheduled appearance by SJEH VP of External Affairs Renee Hastick-Motes furnished members of Community Board 14's Health and Social Services Committee at their June 6 meeting with an extensive rundown of new technologies being implemented by the healthcare site, along with imminent construction projects to expand customer care.

Motes divulged new strategies to better educate the Emergency Room when addressing comments issued by CB14 member and NYS Assembly candidate Khaleel Anderson in relation to how St. John's has traditionally been regarded as a site that lacked warmth in its interactions with patients.

"They, meaning our nurses and doctors, had to learn about how to provide patient-centered care. Most of the issues in the ER were that no one got along. The nurses didn't want to work with the doctors and the doctors didn't want to hear the nurses," she described while touching on the training component of the plan in conjunction with the arduous task of applying those concepts.

They were in intensive training for an entire year about what it means to provide compassionate care to the patient. After the training, now the hardest part is implementation [by] taking the all the theory you learned and making it practical. We've seen some great changes and not-so-great

In sharing specific examples of new methods that were taught, the PR and marketing specialist explained how employees have been advised to refrain from screaming at ambulance drivers to hurry up and "get people off the stretchers.

Furthermore, SJEH is imparting a

number of best practices to rise above the pressure felt by workers on days when they're short-staffed.

"So, we need to make sure they understand it's communication, it's building relationships and it's also letting some people go.'

But despite the positive updates, Hastick-Motes didn't guarantee a 100-percent transformation in customer care since it statistically takes five years to achieve a thorough cultural shift.

The current hierarchy led by Chief Executive Officer Gerard Walsh is only in its 4th year since the hospital's recent overhaul that resulted in a slew of personnel changes, as well as the addition of patient services.

Among those is a new pharmacy that is now open to the public. In fact, through its partnership with pharmacy services provider, Maxor, according to Hastick-Motes, SJEH is currently running a 340-B program, which allows it to purchase prescriptions at a lower cost. Outpatients will now have the luxury of picking up their medication straight from the lobby before leaving the facility.

It's a venture that is commonly recognized as the hospital's innovative 'meds-to-beds" endeavor.

What's more, the guest speaker apprised the Committee that the pharmacy is only part of an entirely new lobby area in the works. It will include a new cafe serving a limited selection of Starbucks drinks, a "real"

gift shop, a non-denominational reflection/prayer room redesigned wall memorializing past donors, with new furniture and reception space as well. The official opening is slated for October.


In addition, the hospital has engaged an architect to build a comprehensive diabetes and geriatric services center on Beach 34th Street. What will make the unit especially convenient for local elders is the fact that it will be situated in the same building that houses a senior resi-

Hastick-Motes was sure to also mention a forthcoming uptown women's unit SJEH will be adding on Beach 105th Street, called the "Baby-Mother Center." It was noted that monies from a \$7 million NY State Transformational Grant are being used for the undertaking.

"We don't have a lot of discrepancies right now. A lot of what's happening at the hospital is a lot of development; it's a lot of infrastructure changes. There was such a lack of investment in St. John's, the facility itself, and trying to change that within the last three years has been major work," reflected Hastick-Motes.

"You are not just changing a physical location; you're also changing the workers at St. John's who have worked here for 30 years. Trying to change that culture of how to do things, that's a process as well."

Tides And Vibes With Laru Beya

Laru Beya Means "by the beach." It's also the name of an emerging non-profit surf organization breaking waves into the Rockaway community. Aydon Gabourel and Warren Sampson run the group and are dedicated to mentoring and developing youth across the peninsula through surfing.

"I had a daughter and one day she wanted to learn how to surf, and that is kind of how we started thinking about all this," said Gabourel. "But I never felt like this was accessible to me for various reasons because it's expensive to get a surfboard, let alone getting wetsuits. I know there's plenty of kids in the community who feel the same way I did when I was younger, they see others surfing and think 'wow,' but because of financial reasons and not having the guidance to learn prevents them from trying."

Gabourel collaborated with his cousin Warren to turn their motivation into reality, and had some help along the way.



"Breakwater Surfing Co. has been a lifesaver to us," explains Sampson. "They've been amazing about sponsoring us and giving us so many things from boards, wetsuits and more."

Through mutual friends based in Jamaica, another opportunity surfaced when the pair was offered an open invitation by the Wilmot family to fly down to their home in Jamaica. Accompanied by eight kids, who they taught for a week, the group was challenged by intensive top-level surf lessons.

"I started surfing a little over a year ago, but before that, I was working for an IT consultant company and just got out of the Marines after 12 years," Sampson told The Wave. "But then I started surfing every day and resigned from my job to practice in Rockaway. Little by little, I got better at it and was offered good advice by other surfers in the neighborhood ... but the Wilmot family taught me a lot. I went through their whole selection process with their surfinstructors and it was a good time."

Laru Beya wants to try and make visiting Jamaica an annual thing once a year, as well as taking the







kids rock climbing and having fun at amusement parks with the idea of also paying a visit to meet Florida-based surf organization "Sisters of the Sea," in Jacksonville.

For the moment, everything is voluntary, and the duo wants to branch out for help by others in the surf community, currently seeking donations.

Competitors met at Rogers Pub after the game for an afterparty. According to RBVL's president Steve Gifford, they were served "the best Guinness in all of Rockaway."





ment to not allow maintenance to come at 4:45 or not allow the urine to build up in the exits. It's going to be up to us to make sure the building is going to be taken care of by directly dealing with them," communicated Gregory, who has lived at the low-income housing facility for the last 8-10 years.

"Once they come in and fix things that are going on, now we have to hold the edge and be responsible to say, 'ok, you gave us a new cabinet, but now my sink is leaking."

Yulfo stated that tenants need not worry about repairs and general upkeep since HUD will annually assess the buildings. They can withhold Section 8 funding, he said, if the development doesn't score well during inspection.

Following the meeting, The Wave caught up with Simon at the Jun. 11 Community Board 14 meeting. He told us there's "no way" the tenants should accept anything over a 1-percent increase for overdue work and inspections that haven't been issued in three decades.

This past week the weather really impacted fishing. High winds mostly from the east made conditions at times unfishable. Still, those crafty enough or stubborn found ways and areas to fish out of the wind.

Such was the case on Saturday afternoon, as I fished the back of Jamaica Bay and caught blues and some schoolwide bass casing lures into the marshes.

On Sunday morning, the majority of charter boats and headboards found their way deep into Raritan Bay up towards Keyport. Bluefish arrived there, way into the flats, busting on the surface and gorging on baitfish. Those fortunate enough to be there were rewarded big time. The blues were big ones, 8-12 pounds, caught with hammered jigs and top-water lures.

That fishing has been fairly consistent at least for the past two weeks. Striped bass fishing fell off, either because of conditions, or more so, a lack of fish. This will go down as a real lean spring run.

My good friend "Cheach," is a die-hard surfcaster with a pulse on the scen, has caught very few bass. That is the consensus he is hearing from all of his buddies. Sad, because it truly was and is a great fishery. Something needs to done real soon to preserve this treasure.

Bottom fishing from Scotland Light, an area offshore of New Jersey, has been producing sea bass and ling. I spoke with Captain Frank the owner of Find and Feathers, a charter boat out of Jersey, and he gave me the low down." Decent pick; ling and seabass.'

Fluke—when conditions good—are still being caught. Seems the best areas have been Coney Island and Gravesend Bay. Thresher sharks, picking up on the schools of bait inshore, are also showing up. So if the big porgies move in, we'll be okay.
